Wikipedia says, "A platitude is a trite, meaningless, or prosaic statement, generally directed at quelling social, emotional, or cognitive unease. Platitudes are geared towards presenting a shallow, unifying wisdom over a difficult topic. However, they are too overused and general to be anything more than undirected statements with ultimately little meaningful contribution towards a solution.

Examples could be statements such as "it is what it is", "meet in the middle", "busy as a bee", "method to my madness", "better late than never", "just be yourself", "burning the midnight oil", "strength is something you choose" and "nobody's perfect". Platitudes are

generally a form of thought-terminating cliché."

So... why do I disagree?

Some "platitudes" are actually a statement that is intended to bring a better understanding of some subject by the reader. For instance "You can't make your candle glow any brighter by blowing out the other guy's candle" actually is true, according to the laws of nature.

I discovered that is a lot easier to get a young person to understand the intent of my putting that on the whiteboard. To paraphrase a platitude that I am sure you have heard "You can't teach an old dog new tricks" might be a trite, meaningless statement about what I just described.

There's another aspect of platitudes that is interesting. They have to come from someone at some point in time that may actually have been a very astute observation and was much more meaningful when it was first uttered. Let's take a look at few I'm sure you have heard.

"That's The Pot calling the Kettle black." The method of cooking before stoves were invented was to cook over an open fire. Open fires create smoke and soot. The soot gets on anything used to cook over the fire thus both the Pot and the Kettle got black soot on them. There's the facts but... that is not the intent of that particular platitude. The intent is to point out the hypocrisy of someone making an accusation about another person actions that the one making the accusation is doing, or has done the same thing.

"People in glass houses shouldn't throw rocks" That rocks typically break glass is obvious. The intent is nearly the same as "The pot calling the kettle black"

"Blondes have more fun." Can that really have a bit of truth to it? Yes, studies have shown that at a dance blondes get asked to dance more often than brunettes or redheads. Most guys will aim for the blonde. If one really wants to dance, or want to arrange a date he should ask someone that is not blonde. Why? Because, at a dance, the redheads or brunettes get asked less often than blondes therefore the chance of getting a "yes" is greater.

it is difficult to report on neighbors as they have become our friends. This is a 55+ community, and there are family members staying longer than the rules state. We need to get rid of bird feeders pick up fruit lying on the ground and put garbage in covered containers to help get rid of the rodents. Packages of rat poison are available from Ed or Doreen. Tightening and replacing clothes lines with covered wire ones was mentioned again, as the plastic ones sag from weight and the sun. New Business: Donna brought up removing the write up in the Riviera Monthly Media about visitors bringing pets as rules state they are not to bring in any pets. Dog owners don't always stop them from defecating on residents property and are allowing them off leash. Again rules the park should enforce.

A resident felt a neighbors untidy yard a deterent to selling their place.

Fran was thanked for being the Treasurer when Ed was away.

Tie Down Program: Alan has info regarding this. He talked with our contact and people previously sent out to evaluate said shrubs and skirting around were ineligible. Individual applications should be made available in the future and will be contacted then. Percentage of park having this done not a qualification anymore and skirting could be removed at no extra cost. Coach must be older than Sept. 1999 and there is no age limit. Once available, questions will be answered.

POOL AND PET OWNER REMINDERS

FYI: Riviera Estates MHP would like to remind our residents that NO one is allowed to touch the temperature settings on the pool heater and/or the clubhouse air conditioner. Our manager and the Homeowner's Association Executive Board have insisted on this. Pool hours are 9:00 a.m. until dusk daily. Pool is heated in winter, the months of November through March. Please remember when leaving the pool, to CLOSE DOWN THE UMBRELLAS, pick up your trash and close the gates. If you are going by the pool, and see the umbrellas are open, please go in and close them. A wind gust can pick them right up and they become a missile and could damage or injure, along with the umbrella itself getting damaged. Treat our community pool as if it were your own. Thank you.

RESPECTIBLE pet owner as well. When walking your pets, please do not allow them to "potty" in other people's yards. Some are not pet lovers as we are. Your dogs must be leashed at all times, and there are plenty of areas where your dog can go. There is a pet cleanup station in the storage field for your use. Please be sure to clean up after your pet. Also, please try to keep your pet from barking or making loud disturbing noise that can bother a neighbor. Complaints are being received by the office on a constant basis of pet problems in the park. So, at this time, our pet rule policy should be noted. Pets are allowed in park, *UP TO 20 POUNDS* weight restriction. Copies of pet innoculation certificate

must be givien to the office as proof the pet has been vaccinated. There is a *LIMIT OF TWO PETS PER COACH*. Fences for the pets are not allowed to be installed. All pets must be leased at all times when outside the coach. Make certain when you leave your pet, they are not barking the entire time you are gone and bothering your neighbors. If this is the case, please make some type of arrangements that will alter this situation, such as a pet sitter, taking pet with you, or if the problem continues, and complaints continue in the office from residents being bothered by the barking, the park is forced to take steps in resolving the issue, such as requiring you to get rid of the dog, or face eviction procedures. Please be a responsible pet owner and obey the rules concerning them. It is *IMPERATIVE THAT YOU CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR PET EVERYWHERE, INCLUDING THE DOG WALKING AREA*. Please do not ignore these pet owner rules, so that we all can continue to love and enjoy ourpets. But at all times we must be respectful of all the residents that live here, that they are not bothered by our pets in any way. Not by hearing them all the time, or stepping in their waste when out walking etc. Thank you for adherence to the policies and rules.

NOTE: QUESTIONS REGARDING VISITORS OF PARK RESIDENTS BRINGING THEIR DOGS WERE BROUGHT UP RECENTLY. THE PROSPECTUS WAS CHECKED TO TRY TO CLARIFY THE VISITING PET ISSUE. THE ONLY 'RULE' FOUND STATED THAT THE PET RULES OF THE PARK/RESIDENTS ARE THE SAME TO VISITING PETS. NONE OVER TWENTY POUNDS, WALK THEM IN THE QUALIFIED AREAS, AND CLEAN UP AFTER THEM. PLEASE MAKE SURE YOUR "GUESTS" FOLLOW OUR PET RULES.




