



**PECAN PIE BROWNIES** 

#### **Ingriedents:**

1 box Brownie mix, must have instructions for making in 13x9 pan and ingredients listed on the package.

#### **Pecan Pie Filling:**

1 cup Sugar 1 1/2 cups Light Corn syrup 4 Eggs 1/4 cup Unsalted butter1 1/2 teaspoon Vanilla extract2 cups Pecans, roughly chopped

#### **Instructions:**

Preheat oven according to brownie package instructions.

Whisk together the sugar, corn syrup, eggs, butter, and vanilla in a small saucepan. Place on the stove top over medium high heat and begin to cook, stirring continuously.

Mix brownies according to package instructions.

Pour brownie batter into a greased 13x9 inch pan and place in oven to bake for 20 minutes. (see note about cooking time below)

As the brownies bake the filling in the saucepan should have thicken enough to coat your spoon (about 15 minutes). Stir the pecans into the mixture and continue to cook for 2-3 minutes until the mixture reaches the consistency of runny oatmeal. You want it to be loose enough to pour over the brownies but not liquid.

When the brownies have finished pre-baking remove them from the oven and pour the pecan pie filling over them spreading it out to cover the brownies completely.

Place them back in the oven and bake for 25-30 minutes or until the filling only jiggles slightly in the middle when you move the pan.

Let cool to room temperature before cutting. MMMMMMMM.....







#### THE CURIOSITY CORNER

#### Pig War 1859

fter the War of 1812 with Great Britain and our neighbors to the North, we had another entanglement with them. In 1859 there was a confrontation between the U. S. and the United Kingdom over the national boundary around the San Juan Islands, between Vancouver Island (Canada) and the state of Washington. The incident, known as the Pig War, has also been referred to as the Pig Episode, Pig and Potato War, the San Juan Boundary Dispute and the Northwestern Boundary Dispute. The only casualty of this dispute however was the undesired death of one large pig.

The Oregon Treaty of 1846 resolved a boundary dispute between Britain and the U. S., but the description of the boundary through these islands was sufficiently vague enough, that both parties drew different border boundary lines between Vancouver

Island and the United States. Each country claimed sovereignty over San Juan Island by drawing the boundary line through a different strait on each side of the island. During this period Britain set up a sheep ranch to be owned and operated by the Hudson Bay Company on San Juan Island. Americans began hearing about this fertile land and by mid-1859 approximately 28 American settlers had arrived on the island. They staked claims on British Columbia land, owned by the Hudson Bay Company as sheep grazing land. Consequently, the British considered such claims illegal and the settlers as squatters.

On June 15, 1859, the vague terminology of the borderline led to conflict. Lyman Cutlar, an American farmer, moved to San Juan Island claiming that the Donation Land Act of 1850 gave him the right to settle there. One day he came out of his dwelling to see a large black pig rooting through the garden eating his tubers (potatoes). It apparently was not the first time that this had happened, but it was going to be the last! He picked up his rifle, took careful aim, and... kill the PIG! The pig was owned by an employee of the Hudson Bay Company, an Irishman hired to run the sheep ranch.

The Irishman, Charles Griffin, had several pigs and let them roam freely. Cutlar offered \$10 (about \$280.00 today) as compensation but Griffin refused. Griffin demanded \$100 (equivalent to about \$2,800.00 today). The ensuing argument about who was responsible for keeping the pig out of the garden never reached a satisfactory conclusion. When British authorities threatened to arrest Cutlar, American settlers called for military protection.

Fort Victoria, held by the British on Vancouver Island, could guard only one of the two straits in the disputed area. However, control of San Juan Island would give any fort erected on the island commanding coverage of both straits, and each country recognized the strategic significance of the island.

The U. S. military's initial response was to send Captain George Pickett, yes, the person who later would lead the ill-fated charge at Gettysburg, to prevent the British from landing military forces. He apparently wasted little time verbalizing his intensions and after some initial boasting from the colorful captain, cooler heads prevailed. After all, neither side thought it was worth going to war over a pig. Orders were given on both sides to exchange fire only in self-defense. Those orders however did not stop either side from hurling insults at one another trying to goad the other into action. Over a period of a couple of months the U. S. side had grown from about 66 soldiers to almost 480 and about 16 cannons. The British force had also grown, (depending upon account referenced) to three to five warships with about 50-70 cannons and approximately 2,150 soldiers.


When word of this situation eventually reached Washington D. C. representatives of both governments were astounded that it had reached such a potentially explosive state. President Buchannan sent General Winfield Scott to resolve the situation. He eventually negotiated a reduction in troops and joint occupation of the island until a resolution to the boundary dispute could be achieved.

San Juan Island remained under joint military occupation for twelve years. In 1871 the Treaty of Washington, signed by both parties, settled disputed territorial claims but apparently did not address the issue of San Juan Island. That issue was referred to Kaiser Wilhelm of Germany for settlement. He referred the issue to an arbitration committee in Geneva, Switzerland. On October 21, 1872 after about a year of deliberation, the commission, through the Kaiser, ruled in favor of the United States. The national boundary dispute, finally settled, was drawn through the Haro Strait, making the San Juan Island a possession of the United States, and finally bringing and end to the "Pig War".

So, while it is nice to know that the U. S. did not go to war with Britain or our neighbor to the north (Canada) over a pig. I still have this nagging question...Did Charles Griffin ever receive compensation for his pig?
