January is named after Janus, the god of the doorway. The name comes from Roman mythology, the door to the year. Janus has two faces which allowed him to look both backwards into the old year and forwards into the new one at the same time. Originally, the Roman calendar ran only from March to December. January and February were added later. During the beginning of the sixteenth century, European countries began officially making January 1 the start of the New Year. The New Year in Britain officially began in January only after the calendar reform of 1752. Before that, it was celebrated on March 25.

• January is the coldest month of the year within most of the Northern Hemisphere and the warmest month of the year within most of the Southern Hemisphere.



- Apart from leap years, January always begins on the same day as October. In leap years, January always begins on the same day as April and July.

Winter in Florida

Any of you come to Florida to get away from the cold, snowy winters of the northern areas of the U.S. and Canada. Most winter temperatures we experience here in Florida are very mild and the coldest spells don't last that long. Comparatively speaking, even our coldest winters can't compare to those of the north (40°F doesn't seem that bad compared to freezing temperatures or lower). And, there is no snow to shovel! We usually warm up within a few days. Most of the time the sun is shining and that makes it better!

According to the weather experts, this winter will be colder and rainier than normal. The coldest temperatures will occur in early January, with other cool periods in mid- and late January. April and May will be hotter than normal, with above-normal rainfall.

As we inch closer to the winter we see all signs pointing to an El Nino in Central Florida and this can often mean wild weather in the form of severe thunderstorms, tornadoes and flooding rain. It's not a guarantee but most of the winter forecast will ride on the power of El Nino and how far south the Southern Jet decides to set up shop in Tampa-St. Pete.

Past El Nino's have been a hit or miss with areas to the north getting the bulk of the rain and wild weather. We feel Central Florida will get its fair share of wild weather, especially in later December and January when we expect to see El Nino in full force.

- 1. c.Wind chill is the combination of wind and temperature and is based on the rate of heat loss from exposed skin. As the wind increases, heat is carried away from the body at an accelerated rate, driving the body temperature down. Wind chill has no effect on cars or other objects.
- 2. After a snowstorm left a foot of snow over the city on February 8, 1899, a record cold wave struck. On February 11, the temperature dipped to -15°F in the District. It was followed by a second great storm called "The Great Valentines Day Blizzard" which dumped another 20.5 inches of snow. That year DC saw a record 54 inches of snow.
- 3. Hail is a chunk or stone of ice dropped from a thunderstorm. Sleet is frozen rain. Freezing rain is liquid rain that freezes to a surface such as the road or a tree.
- 4. False. It has been known to snow with temperatures in the mid 40's. Temperatures are below 32°F up in the clouds where the snow is forming.
- 5. a. 10 inches of snow melts down to about an inch of liquid rain.
- 6. Nor'easters cause high winds and flooding along the coast and heavy snow and sometimes blizzard conditions inland over the Greater Metropolitan Washington area. Nor'easters are responsible for the areas's most hazardous winter weather.
- 7. January, February, and March. It is the latter half of the winter in the Washington area that brings the nor'easters that dump the majority of our snow.
- 8. The January 27-28, 1922 storm dumped 21 inches of snow in DC in 24 hours and had a storm total of 28 inches. It is known as the "Knickerbocker Storm" because the heavy snow caused the collapse of the Knickerbocker theater during a performance. One hundred people died inside.
- 9. Yes. Ice crystals sometimes fall from clear skies when temperatures are in the single digits or colder.
- 10. An inch of ice is heavier than wet snow and is hazardous enough to cause power lines and trees to come down.
