

PINELLAS COUNTY TETHERING ORDINANCE

In November 2014, the Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners voted to pass Ordinance No. 14-40 which bans the unattended tethering of dogs and cats throughout Pinellas County. The term "tether" means to restrain a dog or cat by tying the animal with chains, ropes, leashes, cords, or running lines to any object, structure, or tree.

In order to comply with Ordinance No. 14-40, Sec. 14-31, here are some important points to remember:

- The owner or keeper of a dog or cat must remain outside with the animal while it is tethered.
- The owner or keeper of a dog or cat must keep the animal within sight.
- The tether must be of a size and weight necessary to safely restrain the dog or cat without placing excessive weight or strain on the dog or cat.
- If there are multiple animals, each one must be tethered separately so they do not get tangled.

Beginning May 1, 2015, Pinellas County Animal Services will begin enforcing this measure with citations and fines.

TAO TAI CHI

The founder of Tao Tai Chi was Master Moy who has since passed away. He immigrated to Canada and wanted Westerners to be introduced to this healthy practice. The practice cultivates body, heart and mind regardless of our physical condition.

The center for Tao Tai Chi in Dunedin expanded and bought the huge complex at 453 Edgewater Drive just outside of Dunedin, straight up North Myrtle St. It used to be the old Schiller University and is on a beautiful site facing the inner coastal waterway. They plan to restore all the buildings and make this into a huge International Center for Tai Chi. Their plan is to have students coming from all over the world and staying at the site for workshops. We, in the area, are so fortunate to have this so near to us.

One month ago I saw an ad in the paper advertising an open house. I went to it and was sold. I joined. I have been an ardent member for one month. The beauty of this very affordable membership is that I can go once a week or six times a week; whatever fits my schedule.

Tai Chi reduces blood pressure, chronic headaches dizziness and insomnia. It also helps those suffering from arthritis and rheumatism. It improves brain volume and focus. On a personal note, I have noticed that my balance has improved a lot. I take long walks and would fall a lot, but no more. My blood pressure is much lower, lower left back pain is gone as well as right shoulder pain and I am starting to sleep better. I have improved that much in one month. I am still waiting for my brain volume to expand. My instructor says that 2 years ago she had severe back pain and her quality of life was limited. Now she is hale and fit and teaching Tai Chi.

There are 108 movements. Some movements get repeated throughout. When I watched the experienced students doing the movements I said, "No way am I going to be able to ever do that". Now I have 34 movements and my confidence is growing and I know that I can do this. When we get discourage the instructors will say. "You have 99 years to learn this."

The beauty of this gentle exercise is that it attracted people from all walks of life and all ages and many with medical problems. The most elderly member is 92 years old. It is uplifting to hear people tell you what Tai Chi has done for them. Open houses are held every 3 months and I hope some of you readers can come and join us.






RECIPE OF THE MONTH

- 1 pkg. active dry yeast
- 1 ½ cup warm water (110 ° F), divided
- 4 to 5 cups all-purpose flour, divided
- 2 tsp. salt
- 4 tsp. baking soda
- Coarse salt



- Dissolve yeast thoroughly in ¼ cup warm water. Stir in remaining 1 cup warm water. Mix 4 cups flour and salt in large bowl. Add dissolved yeast, then mix. Add enough additional flour to make a stiff dough. Knead 10 minutes, or until smooth and elastic.
- Roll dough into a ball. Place in a greased bowl, turning to coat top. Cover with a towel. Let rise in a warm place until double in bulk, about 45 minutes.
- Divide dough into quarters; then divide each quarter into 4 balls of dough. Take one of the balls of dough and roll it between your hands to form a coil 20 inches long and ½ to 3/8 inch in diameter. Shape coil into a pretzel shape, pinching ends to shaped pretzel. Shape remaining dough into coils, then into pretzels. (Note; if you don't know how to shape the pretzel you can simply cut coils into bite size nuggets).
- Dissolve baking soda in 4 cups of water; bring to a boil. Drop pretzels, one at a time (or half dozen bites), into boiling water and let boil 1 minute, or until pretzel floats. Remove and drain.
- Place drained pretzels on buttered baking sheets. Sprinkle with coarse salt. Bake in a 475° F oven for 12 minutes, or until golden brown. Place on rack to cool. Serve with mustard. Makes about 16 pretzels.
- For even tastier pretzels, top with pizza sauce and cheese, place back in oven for about 5 minutes (until cheese melts).

Ancient bones offer clues to evolution

cientists may have discovered a new human ancestor to go along with "Lucy," the 3.2 million-year-old Australopithecus afarensis female from eastern Africa. Dubbed "Little Foot" because of his small bones, this specimen was unearthed in South Africa in the early 1990s. His skeleton was almost completely preserved after falling down a narrow cave shaft and dying there. Whether Little Foot was a relative of Lucy's or a different pre-human species has been a subject of debate among anthropologists, but a new dating process suggests that Little Foot lived and died some 3.67 million years ago, close to the same time as Lucy.

Although some scientists dispute the accuracy of the dating technique, if it holds up it suggests an evolutionary link between different species of Australopithecus in ancient Africa, as well as evidence of where in Africa modern humans began to develop.

Birds do it, bees do it, and so do amorous mice

rom time immemorial, men have wooed their lady loves with romantic (if sometimes off-key) music. Now scientists from Duke University believe that love songs aren't just for humans. Mice also sing to females they hope to attract, although they aren't likely using Barry White.



Instead, mice rely on high-pitched sounds outside the range of human hearing, using specific tunes when they smell a potential mate and different ones when they finally set eyes on her. The songs are louder and composed of more complex sounds when they smell a female scent, and get simpler—but longer—when they finally meet face to face. The complex songs seem to attract females, although what specifically draws them close is still uncertain.

Doctors may soon use lasers to seal wounds

asers are common weapons in science fiction movies, but soon a laser may be used to heal wounds in real life if scientists at Tel Aviv University are successful.

As reported on the Reuters website, the scientists developed optical fiber capable of transmitting infrared light and at the same time measuring the heat of the tissue it's pointed at. This allows them to control the laser's power accurately and use it to "weld" tissue effectively without any burning or scarring. Collagen aids the bonding process, growing firm as the skin cools down.

This laser-aided process may result in stronger bonding with fewer scars than traditional suture offers. Initial tests on humans showed successful healing with less scar tissue; examinations one year after surgery should demonstrate whether the laser produces less scarring than needle and thread.

Twin suns may support rocky worlds—in theory

any solar systems around the universe are binary, with two stars orbiting each other in space. Scientists have long believed that rocky planets can't form in these systems because of gravitational forces that would cause planetesimals (worlds in the process of forming) to destroy themselves in collisions instead of slowly merging with each other. Thus, the common image of a world with two (or more) sunsets on the horizon seemed relegated to movies.

But new studies suggest that planetesimals behave differently than had been thought, according to the Sci-News website. Astronomers previously theorized that small worlds seek a circular orbit, leading to collisions around binary stars; now they believe that planets in these systems may take on an oval orbit as they form, avoiding crashes and eventually accumulating a rocky mass. Such worlds could see more than one sun in the sky, and may be able to support life.







