

ELECTORAL COLLEGE FACTS

ccording to <u>livingfacts.org</u>, the framers of the Constitution to established the Electoral College in the Constitution to

forge a compromise between those who wanted the president to be elected by members of Congress and those who wanted a president elected by a popular vote.

Today, 538 electors constitute the Electoral College. Each state is allocated electors equal to its number of representatives in the U.S. House of Representatives (currently a total of 435) plus its two senators (a total of 100). The District of Columbia is also allocated three electors. These numbers can change every 10 years, based on the results of the **census**. State laws differ on how electors are chosen.

Forty-eight states and the District of Columbia have a **winner-take-all policy** that the Electoral College must follow. That means that a candidate who wins, say, 51% of the state's popular vote is awarded 100% of the state's electors. Maine and Nebraska allow electors to be split between parties, proportionally to how their candidates won in different parts of the state.

There are 5 times when a president has been elected by winning the Electoral College vote but not the popular vote. This happened in 1824, 1876, 1888, 2000, and 2016.

The state with the highest number of Electoral College Votes is California with 55, followed by Texas with 38. New York and Florida have 29 each. Illinois and Pennsylvania each have 20, Ohio has 18. Michigan and Georgia each have 16 votes in the Electoral College.

In March 2020, a Pew Research Center study found that a majority of U.S. adults (58%) were in favor of amending the Constitution so the presidential candidate who receives the most votes nationwide wins, while 40% preferred to keep the current system in which the candidate who receives the most Electoral College votes declares victory.

HISTORY OF U.S. PRESIDENTS

Compiled by Terri C.

*Note – many of our Nation's Presidents were Military Veterans who fought to protect and defend our country. They demonstrated leadership skills and the willingness to put their life on the line for our freedom, independence and the preservation of our safety.

1. The man who refused to be King, became our first "Mr. President"- GEORGE WASHINGTON

Shortly after the close of the Revolutionary War, it became clear that he had the spirit and leadership qualities needed for this untested office. He had guided America's first Army to victory with his strategy, served as Chairman of the Constitutional Convention and as a Federalist; he worked to have the Constitution ratified by all states. He served from 1789 to 1797.

2.Also a Federalist (the party of colonial aristocracy) **JOHN ADAMS** became our 2nd President. Although the founding fathers had hoped for an election along nonpartisan lines, separate two-man tickets evolved. His opponent (Thomas Jefferson) automatically served as Vice President.

He was the first to live in the White House, even though it was drafty, unfinished and only partly furnished. He served from 1797 - 1801.

3.An aristocrat, who fearlessly favored the common man, was **THOMAS JEFFERSON**. He stood for an equal chance for all on merit and for education of the masses and favored a small, decentralized inexpensive government. He was a Democrat-Republican, whose greatest achievement was the purchase of the vast Louisiana Territory from Napoleon. His tombstone reads "Author of Declaration of American Independence, of the statute of Virginia for Religious Freedom and Father of the University of Virginia. He served from 1801 – 1809.

4. When Jefferson followed Washington's precedent and declined a third term, he chose his Secretary of State **JAMES MADISON** to succeed him. Madison was famous and well known for his work at the Constitutional Convention of 1787. His wife, Dolley, was one of the most famous White House hostesses. The landowners of the South and the new Western States re-elected him in 1812. In the War of 1812, he had to flee from the White House when the British burned Washington. History holds him high as the Father of the Constitution. He served from 1809-1817

5. To demonstrate that he was the head of a united nation, JAMES MONROE toured the North and the West. <u>He bought Florida from Spain</u>. In 1820, he was re-elected without opposition. His name is on the Doctrine that the US would hold its own safety endangered by colonization or intrusion of foreign authority. He served from 1817 – 1825.

6.JOHN QUINCY ADAMS – nonpartisan, son of President John Adams, became the first President to receive fewer popular and electoral votes than an opponent, but was selected by the House of Representatives, as none of the candidates received a majority of the electoral votes. He served from 1825 – 1829

7.ANDREW JACKSON – known as "Old Hickory" symbolized the common man. He entered the White House as a war hero, leading 6,000 backwoodsmen in defeating 12,000 British at New Orleans in 1815 and <u>put down a Seminole Indian uprising in Florida in 1818</u>. His election marked the founding of the Democratic party He served from 1829 – 1837

8.MARTIN VAN BUREN, who had just served as Jackson's Vice President won with 170 electoral votes. During the panic of 1837, banks closed across the nation. He refused to interfere with the country's economics and was defeated. He served from 1837 – 1841



9.WILLIAM HENRY HARRISON was a member of the newly formed Whig party (dissident Democrats). A war hero and veteran of the War of 1812, he was an Indian fighter and a Treaty maker. He died from pneumonia after one month in office in 1841

10. JOHN TYLER became the first Vice-President to become President through the law of succession. Tyler's rift with his (Whig) party grew so intense that in 1843, impeachment resolutions were introduced, but later dismissed. Marks of his stormy administration were a treaty with China, a bill admitting Florida to the union, and a resolution leading to the admission of Texas. He served from 1841 - 1845.

11. JAMES K POLK was successful in an era of expansion. He achieved his 4 goals: reduction of the tariff, establishment of an independent treasury, settlement of the Oregon boundary dispute and the acquisition of California. He died 3 months after leaving office and served from 1845 – 1849.

12. ZACHARY TAYLOR knew very little about politics, had never run for office before and had never voted. He was a national hero through his Mexican victories, and his popularity got him into office. Taylor died suddenly after 16 months in office, leaving a legacy of inflexible faith in the Union. He served from 1849 - 1850

13. MILLARD FILLMORE was the 2nd Vice President to become President by succession. Known as the last of the Whigs, he had risen from a farm in upstate New York, with humble beginnings and held moderate views. Though a Northerner, he stood behind the Compromise of 1850 and signed the Fugitive Slave Act, which enabled slave owners to seize runaway slaves in the North without recourse to law. His signature on the Act marked the end of his political career. He served from 1850-1853.

14. FRANKLIN PIERCE didn't like politics and didn't want to be President, Although he ran as a "dark horse" candidate for the Democrats, he made no speeches during the campaign but he overwhelmingly defeated Gen Winfield Scott with 254 electoral votes to 42. The Gadsden Purchase secured from Mexico parts of Arizona and New Mexico and signed the US-Japanese trade treaty. He served from 1853 – 1857.

15. JAMES BUCHANAN came into office at a time when States' rights over slavery were a bitter issue. Two days after his inauguration the Supreme Court ruled in the Dred Scott case that Congress had no right to exclude slavery in a new territory. Now the divide between the North and South was clear. Before his term ended, South Carolina and 10 other states seceded from the Union and the Confederacy was formed. He took no vigorous action to prevent Civil War. He served from 1857 - 1861.

16. ABRAHAM LINCOLN won the election in 1860, with his opposition to the extension of slavery being firm and his debates with Stephen A. Douglas on the issue brought him national attention. He called for 75,000 volunteers to suppress the rebellion and before it ended some 600,000 men died in battle. Lincoln's patience and determination saved the Union. For 2 years, he watched one inept General after another fail against the genius of Robert E Lee, until he picked Ulysses S. Grant to lead the command. This nation was grief stricken upon his assassination in 1865 at Ford's Theater in Washington, DC. He served from 1861 – 1865.

17. ANDREW JOHNSON was Vice President when Lincoln died and was sworn in to succeed him. He faced a hostile Congress when he vetoed radical Republican legislation, it was passed over his head. He was impeached on 11 charges and tried by the Senate. The vote was one short of the 2/3 required and the charges were dropped. He served from 1865 - 1869.





18. ULYSSES S GRANT was a West Point graduate who served in the Mexican War and won the Civil War for the North. With no political experience, he chose friends and (unfit) favorites for his cabinet, a bribe to his brother caused him to order the Treasury to sell gold which resulted in the stock market panic of 1869. He served from 1869-1877

19. RUTHERFORD B HAYES answered the call for the need to reform from Grant's scandals. He was honest, capable and beyond reproach as the politically impeccable Governor of Ohio. He began civil service reforms and enforced a sound money policy. He served from 1877-1881

20. JAMES A GARFIELD was a Civil War brigadier general who had served for four months when he was fatally shot by a disgruntled office worker, in 1881.

21. CHESTERA ARTHUR – Vice President who became President after Garfield was shot, he stood solidly for civil service reform and passed the Civil Service Act into law. He prosecuted (other) Republicans involved in a post office scandal and supported the tariff of 1883. He served from 1881 - 1885

22. GROVER CLEVELAND brought the Democratic Party back into power after one of the dirtiest campaigns in US political history split the Republicans and cost them the Catholic vote. He was the only President to succeed his successor. He served from 1885-1889, and 1893–1897.

23. BENJAMIN HARRISON - grandson of the 9th President, who under the influence of industrial giants, signed the McKinley Tariff Act, the highest tariff enacted. He served from 1889 – 1893

24. GROVER CLEVELAND - served his second term from 1893–1897

25. WILLIAM MCKINLEY served during the Spanish- American War in 1898. Spain gave up Cuba and ceded Puerto Rico, the Philippines and Guam to the United States. He was assassinated in 1901, and was succeeded by T. Roosevelt. He served from 1897-1901.

26. THEODORE ROOSEVELT (TR) of Spanish-American War "rough rider" fame served 2 consecutive terms and accomplished conservation of natural resources, urged the building of the Panama Canal, halted a German attempt in South America and sent a battle fleet around the world. For his mediation of the Russo-Japanese War in 1905, he became the first American to win the Nobel Peace Prize. He served from 1901- 1909.

27. WILLIAM H TAFT, supported by TR won the Electoral College 2-1. He was unsuccessful in trying to regulate Federal spending within a single budget. He served from 1909 – 1913

28. WOODROW WILSON won with 435 electoral votes and enacted the Federal Reserve Act, the Federal Trade Commission and reduction of tariffs. He served from 1913 – 1921

29. WARREN G HARDING stood for "America first" and called an International conference to limit armament in 1921. He died in 1923, and was succeeded by Vice President Coolidge.

30. CALVIN COOLIDGE reduced the national debt by billions during his term of 1923-1929

31. HERBERT C HOOVER focused on prosperity and prohibition. Within months of his term, the stock market crashed. In 1930, he signed the Executive Order creating the <u>Veteran's</u> <u>Administration</u>. He served from 1929 – 1933

32. FRANKLIN D ROOSEVELT who campaigned by radio, called for Federal action in the Great Depression and a New Deal. He won by a landslide. In his first 100 days, he provided the action he promised. Stricken with infantile paralysis, his strong drive kept him going. He signed the GI Bill into law, and the <u>Social Security Act of 1935</u>, creating a social insurance program for retired workers. He served from 1933 – 1945, after being re-elected to a 3rd term –he died while in office

33. HARRY S TRUMAN faced a monumental job when FDR died. A former soldier, his was the decision to stop the Pacific fighting with the atom bomb. During his term, the United Nations came into being and he generated the Marshall Plan and the Four Point program to aid distressed nations. He served from 1945 - 1953

34. DWIGHT D EISENHOWER (former WWII Supreme Commander) won 2 elections with both popular and electoral votes (442 in 1952, and 457 in 1956). "Ike's " first act was to end the Korean War with a cease fire negotiation. His world tour was to convince the world of America's peaceful intent. He served from 1953 – 1961.

35. JOHN F KENNEDY found a new dimension to politics – television, which helped bring him victory in 1960. In WWII, he commanded a PT boat in the Pacific. He witnessed the nation's triumphs in space, and proposed Civil Rights Act. His assassination shocked the world in 1963.

36. LYNDON B JOHNSON was sworn in 1 hour and 38 minutes after JFK died aboard the plane carrying the body of the late President. During his term there were major tax cuts, the Clean Air Act and Civil Rights Act of 1964 were signed and the Social Security Administration created Medicare and Medicaid in 1965. He served from 1963 – 1969.

37. RICHARD M NIXON ended the war in Vietnam in 1973 and also the military draft. He established the Environmental Protection Agency and presided over the Apollo 11 moon landing. He was the first and only American President to resign the office, after the Watergate scandal in 1974. He served from 1969 – 1974 and was pardoned by his successor in 1974.

38. GERALD FORD has the distinction of being the first, and to date the only person to serve as president without being elected to either the presidency or the vice presidency. He served as Vice President of the United States since December 6, 1973, following Spiro Agnew's resignation from that office and as President since August 9, 1974 following Nixon's resignation. He pardoned Nixon and also created a conditional elemency program for Vietnam War draft dodgers. Ford's focus in domestic policy was on the economy, which experienced a recession during his tenure. He served from 1974 - 1977

39. JAMES E "JIMMY" CARTER aspired to make Government "competent and compassionate" and responsive to the American people. Under his Administration, the Department of Energy and the Department of Education, were established. He established a national energy policy that included conservation, price control, and new technology. He was awarded the 2002 Nobel Peace Prize for his work to advance democracy, Human Rights and promote economic and social development. He appointed record numbers of women, blacks and Hispanics to Government jobs. He served as President from 1977 - 1981.

*On March 22, 2019, he also became the nation's longest-lived president, surpassing the lifespan of George H. W. Bush, who died at the age of 94 years.

**To this day, at his age of 96, the Carters still support Habitat for Humanity (since 1984). Habitat is the largest not-for-profit builder in the world.

***And this summer of 2020, when police killed George Floyd and reignited protests against racism and police brutality, Carter spoke out in support of those peacefully protesting.

"People of power, privilege, and moral conscience must stand up and say 'no more' to a racially discriminatory police and justice system, immoral economic disparities between whites and blacks, and government actions that undermine our unified democracy. We are responsible for creating a world of peace and equality for ourselves and future generations," he said.
