Reminders:

- Email Address: Please register your email address with Maggie Stokes our Website Administrator so you do not miss out on all the updates that she sends out. Please contact Maggie at sunsetpalms3401@gmail.com to be added to the distribution list.
- **Speed Limit is 10 MPH:** Observe the speed limit and all stop signs. This applies to ALL residents and vendors.



- No Parking on the Sidewalks: Anyone visiting you needs to be asked not to park on the sidewalks. Street parking is only allowed to accommodate carport or unit maintenance. Please do not park directly across from someone else's driveway, as it makes it extremely difficult for them to exit the driveway. Please use common sense and do not park near or on corners or close to intersections. We encourage parking on the same side of the street to avoid traffic having to "zig-zag" to get by, or be completely obstructed.
- Weeds and Pressure Cleaning: The recent heavy rain, and humid weather are perfect ingredients for the weeds to grow, and the mold to form on the mobile homes. Hopefully you have made arrangements to have someone look after your home and to trim the bushes, and weed your planters, gravel/stones, and flowerbeds. If you have received a call or a letter, and the yard work is still not done Management reserves the right to have work done and charge the resident a service fee of \$25.00 per hour with a one (1) hour minimum for each time work is done
- **Guests:** Please remember to register all guests staying more than two (2) nights. ALL guests must be registered at the Park Office and obtain a temporary parking pass if your driveway can't accommodate their vehicle. A guest is a person whose stay does not exceed thirty (30) total days in any twelve (12) month period. No pets may be brought in with Guests. Guests can't stay at a home if the resident is not there during the entire visit.

Trash collection is on **Tuesdays** and **Fridays**. Recycling is on **Wednesdays**. Remember to call the City of Pinellas Park to schedule any oversize trash pick-up: (727) 369-0690. Waste Management will not pick up furniture, old carpet, TV's, or building supplies.

- Recycling & Household Electronics & Chemical Collections is located at 2855 109th Ave N, St. Pete, FL 33716. No charge to drop off electronics, TV's, old paint, etc.
- Pinellas County Solid Waste is located at 3095 114th Ave. S, St Pete, FL 3371. Cost is \$10, **PLEASE DO NOT, UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES FEED STRAY ANIMALS**. H ello from the Board of Directors, At this reporting, we have to our knowledge NO cases of the virus in our park. Thanks mainly to our residents wearing their mask and maintaining social distancing. The facilities are still not allowed for guest to use during this pandemic.

The Board recently approved a new aluminum trailer for maintence staff use. The old trailer has outlived its life, mainly due to the frame rusting out. Citrus Park Well Drilling replaced existing bladder tanks in the pump room and installed a cycle stop valve and new bladder tank for irrigation. Also there was cost savings verses cost of two tanks.

Eight (8) diseased palm trees were cut down by our tree company that was also approved at the August Bourd of Director's meeting.

We are now in the hurricane season. Be sure to check your list and have what you need in you home, plus review evactuation routes, should the park need to be evactuated. Remember to put all flower pots, chairs, and etc. away. They become flying projectiles.

Our thoughts and prayers for out to our sick and shut-ins, and those who have lost love ones.

Lift Station Monthly Reminder – Important

Submitted from the Office

LUSH ONLY: Body waste and toilet paper. It is highly recommended that only one ply toilet paper be used to prevent clogging the toilet.
DON'T FLUSH: Tampons- Sanitary Pads – Diapers – Depends – Swiffer Cloths – Dust Cloths – Wet Wipes – Kleenex – Food, etc.

When we flush, the waste goes into a <u>holding tank</u> that has two pumps to expel the waste <u>UP</u> <u>and OUT</u> into the Pinellas Park sewage system. When any of the above gets flushed, it clogs the pump, overheats it, and burns out the motor.

Recipes for the month

Cherry Cheese Coffee Cake

INGREDIENTS FOR THE COFFEE CAKE: 2 packages (8 oz. each) refrigerated crescent rolls 1 package cream cheese, softened 1/4 c. powdered sugar 1 egg 1/2 tsp. vanilla or almond extract 1 (21 oz.) can cherry pie filling (or any fruit pie filling, as long as it's in syrup!)



FOR THE GLAZE: 1/2 c. powdered sugar 2 to 3 tsp. milk

2 to 5 tsp. mink

INSTRUCTIONS Preheat the oven to 350 degrees.

Unroll the crescent dough. Separate into 16 triangles, and set 4 aside for decoration.

On a baking sheet, arrange the 12 triangles into a circle so that the longer points are in the center but do not meet. Use a rolling pin to roll the dough into a 14-inch circle, pressing the seams together and leaving a 3-inch hole in the center.

For the filling, combine the cream cheese, powdered sugar, egg and vanilla in a medium bowl. Mix until smooth and creamy and then spread over dough. Leave about 1/2 inch uncovered at both edges of the dough. Top the whole thing with your pie filling.

Use a pizza cutter to cut those 4 triangles you set aside earlier into thirds. Start at the wider end, as it's easier to judge where your triangle should be cut. Arrange the strips evenly over the filling and press the ends to seal at the center and outer edges.

Bake for 25 to 30 minutes, or until it's golden brown. Then drizzle the glaze over the top!


