utumn is in full swing as we head into October. This also means that our seasonal neighbors will be starting to make their way back to Teakwood.

I would like to review putting anything in your yards. We recently covered satellite dishes, a no-no, that cannot be in the yard and must be attached to the home. You are responsible for removal even if you do not use it. There is no storing in yards. This means that you cannot have storage shed or leave anything out. If you have a Park approved "patio" you may leave lawn furniture and/or a grill out. If you are a seasonal resident, please make sure to properly store these items in your shed or home prior to leaving Teakwood for any length of time.

I mentioned Park approved, as you all know from reading the Rules and Regulations, this means anything you add to your yard, be it a patio or flag pole, you must draw a diagram of what you are wishing to do, submit the drawing to Teakwood Village with your name, address and telephone number and wait for the actual approval before you begin any work. If you are not sure whether or not to submit a drawing call the Main Office for clarification. If you do not have prior approval, you will have to remove the project, submit plans then start all over again. NOTE: Our approval is only for putting something on the land. YOU MUST contact the City of Largo to make sure that you do not need a permit.



#### WATER ALERT – IMPORTANT NOTICE:

The method of water treatment for Pinellas County and its wholesale customers will be temporarily modified between Monday, Sept. 23, and Saturday, Oct. 12. The second of two short-term changes from chloramine to chlorine disinfection in 2019, is a routine maintenance measure designed to optimize water quality.

The disinfection program is designed to maintain distribution system water quality and minimize the potential for any future problems. There have been no indications of significant bacteriological contamination problems in the system. The water will continue to meet all federal and state standards for safe drinking water.

Kidney dialysis patients should not be impacted, but they should contact their dialysis care provider for more information about chlorine treatment. Fish owners should not be affected if they already have a system in place to remove chloramines, but they should contact local pet suppliers with any questions.

Customers may notice a slight difference in the taste and/or odor of the water during this temporary change in treatment. Chlorine was used as the primary disinfectant in the water for more than 50 years prior to 2002. Pinellas County switched to chloramine in 2002 to ensure compliance with Environmental Protection Agency standards. Many communities using chloramine convert back to chlorine for short periods of time to maintain system water quality.



#### **FACTORS LINKED TO STROKES & HEART ATTACKS**

bout 800,000 Americans have a stroke every year, according to the CDC. It's the fifthleading cause of death in the U.S. and a major cause of disability among older adults. Most strokes are triggered by a blood clot in the brain; in other cases, a blood vessel bursts. High blood pressure, high cholesterol, obesity, diabetes and smoking are the biggest risk factors, but they aren't the only ones. Here are some lesser-known factors that have been linked to a higher risk of stroke and heart attack, and what you can do about each:

- 1. Not enough (or too much) sleep: The evidence is mounting that skimping on sleep significantly increases your risk of stroke. In one study, researchers found that regularly getting less than 6 hours of sleep a night quadrupled the risk of stroke symptoms among middle-aged people of normal weight. But other studies indicate that too much sleep also increases your risk. "The sweet spot you should shoot for is seven to eight hours a night."
- 2. Bad oral hygiene: Brushing and flossing every day doesn't just help your teeth; it may also keep your cardiovascular system healthy. A 2018 study found that the worse your dental hygiene, the higher your chance of having a stroke. Doctors aren't sure why, but it's possible that the bacteria that infect your gums seep into your bloodstream, causing blood vessel inflammation and other problems.
- 3. Episodes of irregular heartbeat: Do you sometimes feel your heart jumping around in your chest? If so, you may have atrial fibrillation, or "AFib," a common heart rhythm problem. Untreated AFib doubles your risk of heart-related death and increases your risk of stroke by a whopping 50%, yet most people who have AFib don't know it. (Note: It's most prevalent in people over age 65.)
- 4. A single night of binge drinking: Maybe you've heard about studies that show drinking red wine or beer can help protect against heart disease. That may be true, but too much

alcohol has the opposite effect. One analysis found that if you drink six or more cocktails in an evening, you have a 30 percent higher risk of having a cardiovascular event within 24 hours. And middle-aged men who had just one hangover per year almost tripled their chance of stroke, according to another study. The American Heart Association recommends no more than two drinks a day for men and one drink a day for women.

- 5. Prolonged antibiotic use: A study of 36 thousand women found that taking antibiotics for 2 months or longer correlated with a higher risk of experiencing a cardiovascular event, including stroke. Antibiotics destroy the "good" probiotic bacteria in the gut. When you're taking antibiotics, you can fortify your gut and help restore the good bacteria by eating fermented foods like yogurt, kombucha and apple cider vinegar.
- 6. Flu-like illness: If you've recently had the flu or upper respiratory infection, lookout for symptoms of stroke. Columbia University found that having a flu-like illness increases your odds of having a stroke by nearly 40 percent over the next 15 days. Protect yourself with plenty of handwashing and by getting a flu shot every year.
- 7. Too much sitting: Sitting for prolonged periods, is linked to an increase in your risk of heart disease and stroke. In one study, those who sat for 10 hours or more a day had an 18 percent higher chance of stroke than those who sat for five hours or less, regardless of how much they exercised.
- 8. A diet heavy on red meat: Study after study indicate that eating red and processed meat takes a toll on your ticker. In a 2019 study, researchers found that for every 100 grams of red or processed meat consumed per day, the risk for heart disease increased by 19%. The Cleveland Clinic researchers found that red-meat eaters have higher levels of a gut bacteria byproduct that has been linked to heart attack, stroke and death risk. The good news? You can significantly reduce your risk by replacing red meats with healthy plant protein choices like nuts and beans, according to Harvard research.





#### **Ingredients:**


- 1/2 cup butter

- 2. Add bread cubes & stir in broth until well mixed.
- 3. Place in well greased crockpot.

#### Savoury Sweet Potato Crumble

Another time-saver as you can make this ahead of time & refrigerate until ready to bake. **Ingredients:** 

- 9 large sweet potatoes
- 1 tsp salt
- 3/4 tsp each ground pepper, cinnamon & nutmeg
- 1/4 tsp ground ginger
- 1 1/2 cups orange juice
- 1 cup flour
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 cup chopped toasted pecans
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 2/3 cup butter, cubed

#### **Directions:**

1. Preheat oven to 400F. Pierce potatoes in a few places, then place on a baking sheet. Bake in centre of preheated oven for 50 - 60 minutes.

2. Cut in half. Scoop flesh into a large bowl. Mash potatoes & sprinkle with salt, pepper, cinnamon, nutmeg & ginger. Stir in orange juice.

3. Lightly butter a 9 X 13 baking dish. Add potato & smooth surface.

4. In a bowl, stir flour with sugar, pecans, cinnamon & salt. With a fork or pastry blender, gradually work in butter until mixture is crumbly. Sprinkle evenly over potatoes.


5. Reduce oven to 350F & bake in centre of oven until topping is golden, 50 - 60 min. Let stand 5 min.
