INJURY TO INSPIRATION

Jennifer Wood meets Candace Carnahan

andace Carnahan is a necessary voice in the world of Health and Safety. At the age of 21, the Miramichi, New Brunswick native lost her leg at a workplace incident – an incident that could have been prevented and nearly took her life.

Twenty years later, Candace has built a successful career as a keynote speaker and safety advocate; she recounts her story in a way that is thought-provoking, emotional, humorous, and leaves her audiences inspired



to make positive shifts towards keeping themselves and each other safe. She speaks with ease and confidence to small and large sized corporations, and at conferences and symposiums around the globe. To date, she has spoken to over half a million people, and her roster of clients include Procter & Gamble, Alabama Power, Irving Oil and General Motors to name but a few.

Carnahan is a beacon of positivity as is evident in the challenges she faced in the wake of losing her leg and beyond. When COVID-19 swept through the world, she, like many others,





temporarily lost her livelihood, but just as she faced other obstacles, she saw the lockdown as an opportunity to reinvest in her career.

"At first the shutdown felt like a huge hit," she recalls from her summer cottage in Miramichi. "All of my engagements were postponed in A matter of days. But when my schedule was put on hold, it meant that I could work on my passion project. I partnered with Halifax's 365 Productions to produce six 'Step Up Your Safety' videos, which connect to my story while reinforcing the importance of keeping safety top of mind. The videos are



combined with worksheets and a workbook that reinforce my message of health and safety long after I am gone.

"I also took time to think about how, if at all, my story could resonate in today's climate of COVID-19. I didn't want to be a talking head about this. Then it clicked. Of course, the importance of protecting ourselves and each other with behaviors like hand washing, social distancing and wearing PPE must be top of mind. As companies continue to get back to work amidst this virus, there couldn't be a more meaningful time to be speaking about health and safety and how our attitudes and behaviors can have a positive or negative impact on ourselves, our colleagues and our communities."

If anything, this downturn has afforded Candace the opportunity to double-down on her commitment to health and safety.

I'm excited to get back at it!"


