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

Ballot Amendments
I would like to thank all the members who took the opportunity to vote on the recent ballot amendment proposals. By all accounts, this was the single largest voter participation in our community's history.

The passing of these amendments marks a transformative moment in our history and will benefit generations to come. Despite some misleading information circulating during the voting cycle, these changes place decision-making power in the hands of our members who participate in the governance of our community. Every member has the right—and is strongly encouraged—to participate in the process. No vote can take place without a quorum of all eligible members, which is greater than 50%, and it requires a supermajority (two-thirds) of those who participate to pass.

These changes ensure that a high standard is maintained, align with basic democratic principles, and guarantee that all eligible members can participate. We believe this is a fairer process, as it avoids the negative impact of non-participants and, most importantly, encourages voter participation.

Important Public Safety Notice: Traffic Compliance

We are currently experiencing too many incidents of motor vehicle operators not complying with stop signs or the community-wide 15 mph speed limit.

Our community roads are narrow, and sidewalks are limited. The roadway is frequently shared with residents who are exercising, riding bicycles, walking their dogs, and engaging in other activities. Non-compliance poses a serious risk to pedestrian and cyclist safety.

The Board takes the issue of public safety seriously. With this in mind, additional traffic control and calming devices will be installed in the following areas:

- Mt Piney Avenue
- Mt Piney Road
- Mt Oak
- Americana Drive



As other high-incident areas are brought to our attention, they will also be analyzed and addressed.

Please help us minimize the amount of intervention needed by strictly observing the posted 15 mph speed limit and fully complying with all stop signs. Your cooperation is essential to maintaining a safe community for everyone.

Thank you for helping to keep our community streets safe.

Water Use & Irrigation

We've had some questions from the community about the differences between potable water, well water, and irrigation water, and we're happy to explain.

Potable (Drinking) Water

All homes in our community receive potable drinking water from the City of St. Petersburg, supplied by Tampa Bay Water. This water is treated, tested, and regulated to meet all federal and Florida safety standards. Twelve percent of our monthly CO-OP FEE pays our potable water bill including sewage, the sewage portion of the bill is based on water usage.

Irrigation Water – CO-OP Well System

Our CO-OP uses well water exclusively for irrigation of lawns and landscaped common areas. This system is separate from household drinking water. Well water is fine for landscaping but is not treated or tested for drinking. Please address common area overspray, leaks, or broken sprinklers to CO-OP management.

Reminder: Shareholders are responsible for repairs and maintenance of potable water and irrigation systems on their lot. Example: Shareholders/Residents are responsible for repairing sprinkler systems/heads on their lots and leaky toilets, dripping faucets or any repairs needed after the main supply water valve to their home/lot. If you have questions please contact the office for clarification.

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
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Common Questions

- Is irrigation water the same as tap water? No. Irrigation uses CO-OP-owned wells; homes use City potable water.
- Can irrigation water be used for drinking or washing? No. It is for landscaping only.
- Why does irrigation water sometimes smell or look different? Natural minerals such as sulfur or iron are common in well water.
- Does using well water save money? Yes. It significantly reduces CO-OP potable water costs.
- Can I use potable water for irrigation? No. This is against our Rules and Regulations to help maintain cost of our common utilities.
- What is the common area watering schedule? The business office, gatehouse and founder's park are watered on Wednesday and Sunday. Homes with addresses ending in even numbers may water on Tuesday and Saturday. Addresses ending in odd numbers may water on Wednesday and Sunday. Watering times are from 5:00-9:00 AM and/or 7:00-11:00 PM.

Landscaping & Water Use in St. Petersburg, FL (33702)

Water early morning to reduce evaporation.

Avoid irrigation during or after rainfall.

Use Florida-friendly plants where possible.

Report broken sprinklers, leaks, or overspray promptly (in common areas).

Check your household faucets, toilets and water fixtures for leaks and repair as needed.

Florida Statute 719 (Cooperative Associations)

As a Florida cooperative association governed by FS 719, the Board is responsible for maintaining common-area systems, managing expenses responsibly, and keeping residents informed. Using well water for irrigation supports conservation and cost control.

Thank you for helping to conserve our community's water resources.



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


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Location, location, location!

Homeowners often forget that it's not only the home or community, but location is a primary determining factor as to why buyers select Americana Cove over another community.

According to RREAF Holdings, a national commercial real estate firm that buys multi-family housing, location is the primary factor that determines property value, desirability and investment potential.

Here's how location is a factor for residents at Americana Cove:

Property Value: Communities that have waterfront property generally have higher property values. Look at the competition to Americana Cove and property values become very clear:

- Doral MHP in Clearwater has 527 homes and currently the highest priced home listed for sale in the community according to the Multiple Listing Service is \$220,000 out of 8 homes listed.
- Sunset Palms, which has 520 homes and is located in Pinellas Park, has the highest price home listed at \$160,000 out of 18 homes for sale.
- Clearwater Cascade, Pinellas Park, has 464 homes for sale and the highest price home available as of this writing is \$250,000 out of 17 homes listed for sale.
- Fairway Village, a golf course community in Largo, has 751 homes and the highest price home listed is \$279,000 out of 22 homes for sale.
- Palm Hill, a 1,096-space golf course community in Clearwater, has 45 homes for sale and the highest price listed is \$250,000.

These factory-built housing communities that are competitors to Americana Cove are located inland and not on water. Bay Aristocrat, a community located on open Tampa Bay water in Clearwater has only 361 homes but in spite of the smaller size the highest price home listed is \$380,000 out of 16 homes listed for sale, which is more similar to pricing in Americana Cove, which has more waterfront homes than Bay Aristocrat and several homes listed at \$350,000 and above.

“Even with a 9-hole golf course, Fairway Village and Palm Hill can't compete with the higher home pricing found in the two waterfront communities,” explained Broker Marty Pozgay.

Desirability and Convenience: Buyers in the 55+ age group look at convenience to shopping, dining and medical professionals. Americana Cove is located only 10 minutes from downtown St. Petersburg and minutes to 4th Street. “Both locations offer a high quality of convenience and desirability which buyers want,” Pozgay noted.

Neighborhood: Purchasing property in a community with good “curb appeal” further enhances property values. “Americana Cove is located in highly desirable northeast St. Petersburg and has the added advantage of a 24 hr. manned gate, which is the ultimate in curb appeal as only more exclusive communities have manned gates,” said Pozgay. Out of almost 50 factory-built housing communities in the county, Americana Cove has the only manned gate.
