From the Board of Directors

I hope everyone is enjoying the summer. While it may seem like things are quiet as the summer months are quickly moving by, there is a lot going on in the background. This is the time of year that Board Members are receiving bids for upcoming projects. Even though the projects will not even begin until the new budget goes into effect on January 1st, 2026, all of the information needs to be included in the 2026 budget that will be discussed at the upcoming budget workshops.

By the time you read this article, the first workshop for the 2026 budget will already have been held on August 21st. If you missed it and want to comment, make sure to attend the second workshop, which will be held on Thursday, September 18th, 2025, at 2pm in the clubhouse. All homeowners are invited to attend.

The bottom line on the budget will be the same as always. The Board will examine every aspect of every budget item in an attempt to save as much as possible, but in the end, we need to pay our bills. We are not allowed to start the budget process by setting a monthly fee. We are required to provide a budget that pays our bills and figure out the monthly fee that pays for the budget. Hopefully, we can keep any increase to an absolute minimum.

We have had some unexpected expenditures in the last month. First, our annual pool inspection came with the requirement that we install a new drain cover at the deep end of the pool. The cover is required to be changed every 7 years to assure that it does not deteriorate and become a safety issue. It was replaced by our pool contractor, and we received our new license to operate the pool.

The second issue was more significant. The County conducted its annual inspection of our sewer system and found 2 issues. The first we were able to take care of ourselves with the help of our in-house volunteers. The second, however, we were required to hire a contractor to do it, as it required the replacement of 40 feet of 6-inch clay drainage pipe and 10 feet of 4-inch drainage pipe. We needed heavy equipment to uncover the pipe and replace the original with PVC. We are also not allowed, by Federal law, to touch anything that involves the penetration of the sewer system.

With Labor Day approaching, the flags will be put out over that weekend, but they will be picked up by Monday morning so the grass can be cut, unless we hear from our landscaper that





Identity Theft

Warning signs of identity theft

- Bills for items you did not buy
- Debt collection calls for accounts you did not open
- Information on your credit report for accounts you did not open
- Denials of loan applications
- Mail stops coming to, or is missing from, your mailbox

How to report identity theft

To report identity theft, contact:

- The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) online at IdentityTheft.gov or call 1-877-438-4338
- The three major credit reporting agencies. Ask them to place fraud alerts and a credit freeze on your accounts.
- The fraud department at your credit card issuers, bank, and other places where you have accounts

How to protect yourself from identity theft

- · Do not answer phone calls, texts, social media messages, or email from numbers or people you do not know.
- · Do not share personal information like your bank account number, Social Security number, or date of birth.
- · Collect your mail every day and place a hold on your mail when you will be on vacation or away from your home.
- · Review credit card and bank account statements. Watch for and report unauthorized or suspicious transactions.
- Understand how ATM skimming works and how to protect yourself
- · Learn when it is safe to use a public Wi-Fi network
- Store personal information, including your Social Security card, in a safe place. Do not carry it in your wallet.

Imposter Scam

The top types of imposter scams:

An imposter scammer may call, text, or email to convince you they are someone in authority. They may even use caller ID to make it look like they are calling from an official government or business' number. To commit identity theft, they try to get you to send money or a gift card or share personal information.

- Government imposter scams Unless you contact them first, government agencies typically initiate communication with you by letter. Unexpected contact or demands through any other method may be a scam.
- · IRS imposter scams scammers pretend you owe the IRS money for taxes and may threaten legal action
- · Social Security imposter scams scammers claim there is a problem with your Social Security account or promise to increase your benefits
- · Charity scams scammers pretend to be from a real or fake charity and try to get you to contribute
- · Grandparent scams scammers pretend to be a grandchild or other relative who needs emergency financial help
- Tech support scams scammers tell you your computer's security is at risk and try to remotely access your device and steal personal information or ask for payment
- · Scammers may also pretend to be from your bank or a company you do business with. You might be told you owe money or there is a problem with vour account.


