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




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

Resident will then get a reply asking them to respond with their name and lot number, and once done, the registration is complete.

### **Parking Rules**

his is a reminder RE: the parking rules as well as a few changes to occur effective Jan 1st.

\*\*Each home is allowed TWO cars per home, any extras must be removed from the property right away.\*\*

You will be towed for the following:

- 1. Parking in any space around the clubhouse, office or mailboxes between the hours of 8 am and 10 pm, unless you are using the amenities. (900-530 for the office)
- 2. Parking in any space around the clubhouse, office or mailboxes between the hours of 10 pm and 8 am without a RED hang tag or a YELLOW dated guest pass. (530-900 for the office) You can register for either at the office.
- 3. Parking on the street anytime between 1 am and 6 am.
- 4. Parking anywhere on the property without a general parking sticker.
- 5. Parking a commercial vehicle, anywhere on property. This would be any vehicle with any advertising on it. Or any vehicle that is used for commercial rather than personal use.

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
### **Board Meeting**

### **PET Rules and Regulations**

Il pets must be approved by MANAGEMENT in writing before the pet's owner moves into the COMMUNITY, or before RESIDENT obtains a pet after move-in.

No more than two (2) pets per household.

All pets must be on a leash no longer than six (6) feet at any time the pet is outside of RESIDENT'S homesite.

Pets may not be tied unattended outside of RESIDENT'S manufactured home at any time.

Pets may not be walked on the lawns of any homesite in the COMMUNITY, other than RESIDENT'S homesite.

No pet enclosures, including, but not limited to dog houses, are allowed. Pets must be kept inside RESIDENT'S manufactured home if unattended.

Excessive noise is not allowed, and pets must not annoy RESIDENT'S neighbors. Pets must not be left alone if they bark, cry or whine when by themselves.

No pets are allowed in the COMMUNITY recreation areas at any time.

Guests' pets are not permitted in the COMMUNITY.

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

### September Media:

would like to remind you since we had extreme weather with the past storms and flooding there are actions that need to be taken to ensure the safety and care for your mobile home. Here's some very helpful information I would like to share with you.

### 1. High water and electric bills


- Leaks: Leaky pipes or running toilets are a common culprit for unexpectedly high water bills.
- Inefficient Appliances: Older appliances or a poorly functioning HVAC system can significantly drive up electricity consumption.
- Poor Insulation and Air Leaks: Gaps in insulation, especially in the crawl space, can lead to increased energy use for heating and cooling.

### 2. Moisture barrier (crawl space encapsulation)

- A crawl space vapor barrier is a crucial component of mobile home maintenance, blocking moisture from the ground and protecting the underside of the house from humidity.
- High moisture levels in the crawl space can cause mold, wood rot, and poor indoor air quality, which can further impact the structural integrity of your home.
- Installing or repairing a vapor barrier can cost between \$1,200 and \$4,000, depending on the size of the crawl space and the quality of materials used.

### 3. Releveling your mobile home

- Uneven Floors, Doors & Windows: If your mobile home is unlevel, you might notice uneven floors, doors and windows that stick or don't close properly.
- Structural Strain: An unlevel home can put a strain on its structure, leading to cracks in the walls, ceiling, and even siding.
- Foundation Problems: The primary cause of an unlevel mobile home is often environmental factors, such as shifting soil due to moisture or ground heave.
- Cost of Releveling: Leveling a mobile home typically costs between \$450 and \$900, with single-wide homes being less expensive than double or triple-wide homes.
- DIY vs. Professional: While some minor adjustments can be made by a homeowner, major leveling issues are best left to professionals to ensure proper alignment and avoid further damage.
- In summary, these issues are often interconnected. A lack of a proper moisture barrier in the crawl space can lead to a damp environment, potentially causing shifting soil and resulting in an unlevel mobile home. The unleveling can then lead to structural issues and potentially affect the functioning of your plumbing and electrical systems, ultimately contributing to higher utility bills.
- If you suspect you're experiencing any of these problems, it's recommended to **consult** with qualified professionals to assess the situation and determine the appropriate course of action. Addressing these concerns early can prevent more costly repairs and ensure the safety and longevity of your mobile home.



We have had a few complaints about inappropriate behavior at the pool.

Excessive noise, abusive language and drunkenness are extremely prohibited.

We want all out residents and guest to enjoy the amenities, no one should have to feel uncomfortable with inappropriate behavior by you or your guests.

Your guests are your responsibility!! Make sure you have wrist bands for them and that you are present with them at the pool when visiting. No smoking, glass containers or alcoholic beverages allowed in the pool. Not only is this a rule with the park, but it's a state law that can and will be enforced.

Pool privileges will be revoked if you are reported for any of the above violations mentioned.

### DO NOT LEAVE CHILDREN UNDER 18 UNSUPERVISED AT ANY TIME

We've also had complaints of some pool hoppers taking advantage. Not sure if they're residents or outsiders, but if you suspect people using the pool during normal hours or after hours that don't belong on property call the office immediately. If the office is closed or this is happening on the weekends call the police to have them removed. Reminder pool hours are 9am-10p.

If you see something say something. We're only here at the office during normal business hours. We can't foresee all of the shenanigans that occur when we're not on property to get them addressed. I encourage you to email or fill out a complaint form. When we have it in writing we are able to take action to getting problems resolved the best we can. Your complaint is always kept confidential and the office would never expose any resident who reports any concern that happens on property.

We are aware of the exercise room treadmills are not working. We want you to know that we have budgeted for January to have that room completely redone from top to bottom with new equipment. We thank you for your patience while the room will not be functional. Once it's done it will be beautiful!

I still have a bunch of Plan of Action Hurricanes booklets in the office. Please stop by and pick one up. We all hope and pray that we don't have a season like last year, however it's always better to be prepared and not need it than needing it and not having the correct information and tools to be prepared.

Lastly, I hope you all have a wonderful Labor Day weekend. Be safe and responsible. Our office will be closed Monday September 1st, and resume normal business hours on the 2nd.

- ☐ Water and non-perishable food for several days
- ☐ Extra cell phone battery or charger
- ☐ Battery-powered or hand crank radio that can receive NOAA Weather Radio tone alerts and extra batteries
- ☐ Flashlight and extra batteries
- ☐ First aid kit
- Dust mask, to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- ☐ Whistle to signal for help
- ☐ Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation Non-sparking wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- ☐ Can opener (if kit contains canned food)
- ☐ Local maps



## Additional Items to Consider Adding to an Emergency Supply Kit:

- ☐ Prescription medications and glasses
- ☐ Infant formula and diapers
- ☐ Pet food, water and supplies for your pet
- ☐ Important family documents such as copies of insurance policies, identification and bank account records in a portable waterproof container
- ☐ Cash and change
- □ Emergency reference material such as a first aid book or information from www.ready.gov
- ☐ Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person.
- ☐ Complete change of clothing including a long sleeved shirt, long pants and sturdy shoes.
- ☐ Fire Extinguisher Matches in a waterproof container Feminine supplies, personal hygiene items and hand sanitizer
- ☐ Mess kits, Paper cups, plates and disposable utensils, paper towels
- ☐ Paper and pencil Books, games, puzzles or other activities for children

The dump will be open 8-3 on Tues and Friday, and 8-11 on Saturday. We are going to try this to see if we can keep the illegal dumping under control but still giving you all access. A reminder/the rule, if it wont fit in a large size trash can, it does not belong in the dump area. No furniture, chemicals of any kind, propane tanks, paint, electronics, construction debris, grills, etc...ever. The compactor is for your regular bagged up household trash, the big dumpster is for yard waste and the blue container is for recyclables. ANYTHING ELSE IS THE RESIDENTS RESPONSIBILITY TO HAVE HAULED OFF THE PROPERTY because Valet Living won't pick it up either. If you are caught dumping anything else, that is actually a crime, you will be fined by the county, get a violation letter from us, and we will close the area back up. (we don't want that)

Beginning 8/22, the maintenance staff will no longer be going around to pick up trash or yard waste. Valet Living will still pick up your trash, but all of the same policies above apply pertaining to what is allowed in the dump area and what they will and won't pick up. Everything bagged in trash bags and boxes broken down should be it. It doesn't make sense to have them go back and do the same thing we already pay a vendor for and use up man hours when there are so many other things that need attention on the property. This does include yard waste, you will have to take that to the dumpster because Valet Living does not pick that up. I have faith that this will be a smooth transition, if you have any questions, please call us at (727) 531-9105. Thank you.

Boxes MUST be broken down and put into the Recycling container. • No bags whatsoever should be placed in the roll off container. This container is for unbagged yard waste, and other household trash. If you have bagged yard waste, you can put it into the compactor or open the bag and dump the contents into the roll off. • The roll off container is not for bulky furniture or construction material...if it doesn't fit into an outside type of garbage can, it does not belong in the dump area. Just as the park is not responsible for you getting to work on time, paying your cell phone bill, or getting your oil changed, we must follow Pinellas County Solid Waste Ordinances and are not responsible for taking your old mattresses, tires, appliances, TVs, large bulky furniture, paint, batteries, solvents, construction debris, etc. Again, the roll off and compactor is for "household" trash only. Therefore, you will need to arrange to have prohibited items hauled away or you can take it to the landfill which we believe costs approximately \$11 for a load. The Pinellas County Solid Waste landfill is located at 3095 114th Ave. N., St. Petersburg, FL 33716, about 10 miles away. Their phone number is 727-464-7500. There are several junk removal companies, and we know of one junk hauler, Tampa Bay Junk Pros, who may be offering \$50 off for junk/furniture/appliance removal. Their number is 727-404-5100. • Do not fill the roll off container past the fill line, otherwise it will not be emptied resulting in having to lockdown the dumpster area which is inconvenient for all. If it is full, you may place your items to the side of the container so maintenance can put it in for you once the container is emptied.

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
