



Speaking of dogs, did you see that the Pinellas County Animal Services facility at 12450 Ulmerton Road here in Largo received a \$3.5 million upgrade? Doug Brightwell, Animal Services Director, said the building received a new roof, doors, windows, and other upgrades to help withstand serious storms. It also provided air conditioning, which it had never had before, and a music upgrade. Brightwell said that the upgrades would strengthen the building to withstand a Category 4 hurricane. There is also a new vet hospital with more room and services, which was a much-needed addition. There is a very favorable adoption program going on currently, so if you are interested in adopting a (size appropriate) dog or cat, now might be the time. Pets provide so much comfort and company. I am personally thrilled to hear this because the old facility most definitely left a lot to be desired.

Officer Bowling was here at the end of July and gave us the nonemergency number for the Largo Police Department. This is the phone number you would call if, for example, you need a welfare/health check done on a resident. If you want to write this down somewhere so you have it handy, here it is: 727-587-6730.

There have also been some inquiries as to what phone number to call for an emergency here in the park after hours. Say if you have a broken pipe or, as just happened recently, a toilet that overflowed in the clubhouse restroom. These types of problems definitely need to be reported. Call this number and if no one answers, leave a detailed message. You can also text the information. If you do not get a response, do not worry. The message has been sent and, most likely, received. Here it is: **813-601-5353.**

Do you get your Voice delivered on time? I know I do. My block captain happens to be Angie Faust, and I must say she does a fabulous job getting my publication to me in a timely manner. She and her trusty sidekick (pretty little dog) Brooklyn. And, of course, that would not happen unless Quinn Elock did not get the Voice to the block captains timely. DIAL DIRECTORY IMPORTANCE 2026

Incolnshire is a large community, and we average around 40 move in's each year. The Residents' Club has re-instituted our Welcome Committee this year and we try and introduce Lincolnshire and all it has to offer to new residents. It is difficult to get to all the new move ins since many of them purchase their home but due to renovations or them being snowbirds they are not here immediately. One of the items included in the folder of information we provide to them is a Dial Directory Form. You will see an article and form in the Voice each month reminding everyone to complete a form if you are new or require a change to your information in the current 2025 directory.

At the beginning of 2025 we were missing over 100 Lot# occupied residencies from our directory. COMPACTOR REMINDER

f you are new to Lincolnshire please read this article.

A friendly reminder for all our residents. Whenever you take trash to the compactor, Lplease remember to close the door after depositing your garbage. **DO NOT PRESS THE RED BUTTON**. This compactor is pre-programmed to <u>automatically</u> start compaction after the door has been closed three (3) times. It is very important that the compactor door is CLOSED after you deposit your garbage. Do not throw large items into the compactor. You

will need to wait till the bulk trash container is brought into the community each month. See Voice calendar for dates dumpster is scheduled each month. Don't forget to break down your cardboard boxes before throwing them in the mixed recycle bins. If the recycling bins are full do not overfill them, the lids should be able to lay flat. Put

your recycled items in the compactor instead. When the city comes to take the recycling bins

all the "over" loaded trash ends up on our streets. Please! Please! Think before you overload those containers.

Please do not bring large items furniture etc. that need to be placed in the Bulk dumpster that is brought into the community twice a month. 



ap of entire area for both apartment complexes. Allora (240 apartments), currently under construction bordering 8th Ave and Donegan and the newest possible addition Largo Station (168 apartments), that will border 8th Ave. and the railroad track section of the land.

Brief background regarding the building site

Belleair Development Group purchased 15.5 acres of land from Genesis Communications of Tampa back in December 2023 for \$3.1 million dollars. If you recall the land had previously been zoned farm/industrial land. Many of us may remember attending meetings at Largo City Hall trying to get the zoning request Belleair Development wanted to change it to residential so they could build the apartments. We did win that round, the Commissioners refused the rezoning and the land remained farm/industrial. We expressed our concern about traffic patterns and flooding issues. Studies were done by the Department of Transportation they all showed the current roads could handle the extra traffic; we were also told that any water that fell on the apartment site was required to be contained on that site. Hence the large retention pond. Belleair then announced they would put commercial warehouses on the site. All of this took place over 2 years but no construction for the warehouses ever began. We watched the property sit empty but miss the cows and horses that had been moved off site.

The State of Florida passed the Live Local Act into effect July 1st, 2023. This Act basically

takes away the rights of local municipalities regarding the building of residential living spaces. The State tells local towns and cities that Developers that have land and wish to rezone for residential can basically do it without the towns giving them permission to change the zoning for the property. Hence it was announced at a meeting in September 2024 that Belleair Development Group would proceed with the plan to build the apartments on the acreage they purchased. They then announced it would be broken into 2 phases. Phase 1 is the current construction we see today. Allora Apartments with 240 units. Phase 2 was to be part of the acreage that bordered 8th Ave. and the railroad tracks.

Earlier in 2025 Belleair Development Group sold 9.6 acres for \$7 million dollars to Trammell Crow. That is where the Allora Apartment complex is currently being built.

This latest announcement has Belleair Development Group under contract to sell off the western portion of the land 5.9 acres to SP Ridge Apartments LLC, this is where the Largo Station complex will be built. Purchased price not disclosed. Largo Station apartments will consist of 2 five story buildings with 60 units each, a four-story building with 48 units, a clubhouse, an amenity structure, and 208 surface parking spaces.

Both apartments' projects must provide 40% of the units to be reserved for households earning or below 120% of the area median income for a minimum of 30 years. This is not a regulated Federal Housing project. Designed to provide qualifying rent for single and family professionals like nurses, firefighters and police personnel.

The attached picture is an example of preparing for the SWFL hurricane/tropical storm season or an unexpected power outage. Safeguarding valuable refrigerated foods can prevent both food spoilage and sickness. 3 containers (here are 2 qt zip lock bags and an equivalent plastic container of



ice. Yes, having an ice maker is helpful though using one or 2 ice trays and emptying every 2 days will catch up quickly. In a medium sized cooler this will keep most frozen foods safe for just a few days and other regular refrigerated foods safe for longer. Will not keep frozen foods frozen. The better the cooler the longer the longevity of saving safe to eat foods. Got a small convenience freezer then now is the best time to fill it up with ice and not frozen food

- Another small tip is to limit frozen food purchases to being replenished every 7-10 days. No reason to lose valuable refrigerated foods when the electricity is out for 2-3 days. I am sure you know how I know this! Also, foods that do not require water to rehydrate.

The Military Jeep: Most people have no idea that when they see an old photo of a Jeep on a World War II battlefield, there is about a 50-50 chance they're looking at a Ford. In the 1940s, there was no better place to turn for help than Ford. It was only natural for the federal government to turn to the company that pioneered assembly lines and mass-produced machinery to help boost production numbers. Ford Motor Company was more than happy to oblige, even if its past and future president (according to Ford, Henry Ford retired as company president in 1919, returned following his son and successor's death in 1943 and retired again in 1945).

Ford built approximately 280,000 General Purpose Willys (GPWs) during World War II -- nearly 44% of the war's Jeeps. That included 13,000 amphibious GPW Reconnaissance Vehicles.

For obvious reasons, the military needed to maintain parts commonality between Willys and Ford Jeeps. By now, many components on surviving Jeeps have migrated from one brand to the other as owners search for original replacements. There are still a few telltale signs of whether a vehicle, or at least a given component, came from Ford or Willys.

Motor Trend notes that engine block numbers will start with either a GPW (if built by Ford) or MB (if built by Willys). There is a button that opens the vehicle's rear toolbox, and the recessed metal surrounding it is square on the GPW and round on the MB. Ford used a rectangular crossmember on the front of the frame, while Willys used a tubular one.

When you think about Jeep, you probably picture the famous seven-slot grille. That, believe it or not, is a Ford design. Willys originally used welded steel slats to protect the radiator; it was not until designers at Ford proposed a cheaper, easier-to-produce stamped steel grille that we got the shape we know today.

One of the most fun pieces of Jeep trivia stems from pettiness, not patriotism. In the very first days of Jeep production, Ford stamped its logo on the tailgate. That did not sit well with military leadership, which wanted manufacturers to focus on uniformity across vehicles, not advertising for their company. Ford complied but found other ways to leave a mark -- lots of marks, actually. If you poke around a GPW, you will find little script "F" icons everywhere. They are stamped into sheet metal, they are cast into axle tubes, and they appear on bolt faces throughout the vehicle. The tailgate might have been silenced, but every GPW screams "Ford."

Let us see what one of these vehicles will set you back, should you want to become its curator. I'm sure you would be heartbroken if you knew how many of these incredibly historic military vehicles were chopped up and sold as scrap after World War II, but massive production numbers and ample demand for surplus vehicles in the civilian market following the war mean there are still healthy numbers of survivors.

A quick search on Classic – my go-to aggregator for old vehicles – shows that prices for 1942 and 1943 Jeeps have held steady between \$20,000 and \$30,000 for the past five years. Model year 1944 and 1945 Jeeps used to cost quite a bit more, but they have fallen into that range as well. If you are not picky about every little detail being original, you can find decent examples of the Ford GPW for around \$15,000. If more fragile components, such as seats and soft tops, are included and in good shape, expect to pay significantly more. One particularly desirable Willys MB sold for \$46,200 at a Museum auction this year.

Whichever brand you choose, you will be preserving a priceless piece of American military and automotive history.

A NURSE'S SELF CARE TOOLBOX

This month's article again tries to offer tips on getting the most out visiting our Primary Care Physician/Nurse Practitioner. It would even extend to the specialist who we have been referred to. We want to leave knowing that our issues, small or large, get attention and a careful plan of care.

Because clinicians must quickly address our top concerns, update our records, discuss new symptoms, and coordinate follow-ups all and all within a limited time. Result: medical appointments often feel rushed. Office visits are not a casual discussion with unlimited time.

To get the most out of your visit, it's important to be smart with our time. I suggest we all refrain from certain things. The best result is ensuring we receive the best care possible.

- ✓ Self-Diagnose or I already know what I have. Though self-diagnosing can show that we as patients want to take an active role in our health, problems do arise when it's done without clinical training, often leading to misinterpretation of information.
- Focusing on describing our symptoms, including when they started, how they've changed, and any patterns you've noticed, to give your provider the best chance of identifying what's really going on.
 - ✓ Being unprepared for our physician visit. As a new patient, our provider has less than 20 minutes to review your history, address your concerns, and create a treatment plan.
- Have a list of medicines, allergies, medical diagnoses past and present, prior procedures, and surgeries.
- I also recommend keeping a document, either printed or on your phone, which includes your medications, allergies, medical diagnoses, past procedures and surgeries with dates, and any relevant family history.
 - ✓ Discuss how our symptoms really affect our daily lives or certain parts of activity. Examples: walking, sleeping, and taking adequate nutrition. When we downplay our symptoms by minimizing how often they occur, how intense they feel, or how much they interfere with daily life, it can lead providers to underestimate the seriousness of the issue. This can lead to skipped tests, treatment delays treatment, or missed early signs of conditions like heart problems, infections, or neurological issues. Tell it like it is!
 - ✓ Waiting Until the end of the visit to bring up our real concern. I am notorious when a patient has a list in hand for asking for the last one on that list. Yes, always what is really bothering them.
 - ✓ The "Golden Rule" is also so important here. Treat the medical staff as you and I want to be treated. Further explanation is not necessary here.
 - ✓ Bringing a family member to a doctor's appointment can be helpful, especially if you're feeling overwhelmed for whatever reason. However best to speak for ourselves.
 - ✓ It's easy to mix up roles in a medical office as their badges are not easily read or understand, leading to vital information being exchanged at check in or having our vital signs taken and our earlier information never reaching care provider.
 - ✓ Not fully understanding our medical action can unintentionally and unfortunately disrupt our care. A simple but effective step is to repeat the plan back, so we are on the same page and reassure your clinician that we understand what is up next.
