

BOARD of DIRECTORS NEWS: PARKWIDE VOTE ON SOLAR PROJECT **SET FOR SEPTEMBER 26**

ear Shareholders. On Jan. 22, 2025, your Board of Directors voted to advance a proposal we believe will deliver lasting financial benefits for every shareholder. The installation of solar panels on the clubhouse roofs.

This project is expected to dramatically reduce Palm Hill's electricity charges from the moment it is installed, cutting operating expenses in the very next budget year. With utility costs continuing to rise, renewable energy provides a rare opportunity to take control of a major expense, and keep more money in our community.

The financial case is compelling: Our conservative estimates show a break-even point in only six years, followed by substantial net savings for the remaining 14–19 years of the system's 20-25 year lifespan. These savings will help keep maintenance fees affordable for everyone. Adding to the urgency, federal tax credits that lower our upfront cost will expire on Dec. 31, 2025.

Because this project is considered a material alteration, shareholder approval is required. We have scheduled a special meeting for Friday, September 26, 2025, where a majority of votes (in person or by proxy) will be needed to authorize the project. The official notice and voting materials are being mailed to shareholders.

This proposal is the result of months of research, planning, and cost analysis to ensure it delivers immediate value and positions Palm Hill for a more sustainable future. We will provide more details shortly, including how to vote electronically or by paper ballot.

Your support will be critical. By voting in favor, you will be helping Palm Hill lower operating costs, protect against rising utility prices, and make a strategic investment that benefits every shareholder for decades to come.

On behalf of Palm Hill Board of Directors, let's work together to secure this opportunity and keep Palm Hill strong, sustainable, and affordable.

SPECTRUM FIBER-OPTIC PROJECT UPDATE

PECTRUM UPDATE: It was a full house August 9 at a workshop in the South Rec Hall about the upcoming Spectrum changes. Board member Bill Dresch led the session.

Spectrum has been working in Palm Hill laying the conduits that will contain the new fiber optics, said Bob Newport, board member. Once that phase is complete, Spectrum will

then begin to connect the new system to the homes.

In the new system, residents will receive two XUMO streaming boxes as part of the bulk package. If a resident needs help with the new system, he or she should contact Spectrum. Specify to the customer service representative that your service is part of a bulk contract at Palm Hill in Largo, Florida.

Stay tuned for information on the ongoing changes via web blast.

TIPS/UPDATES FROM CHUCK SILCOX, Board Member

The are working with Spectrum to create a new 732 system that will be available with the new system.

The good thing about the new system is that you can sign into your account anywhere in the world and get all the channels; 732 should be available.

Points to note:

- 1. If you want to watch 732 now before the new system is up and running, and you update to the new XUMO boxes, keep an old set top box to access the old 732 channel.
- 2. We are working to get the new cloud version of 732 running and when up, both should be available for a while.
- 3. If you go to Spectrum and get the new XUMO box(es) and take them home but cannot make them work, call Spectrum and tell them the installation FAILED and you need help.




NEWS ABOUT/FROM VOLUNTEERS

TOILET WATER SAVING PROGRAM STILL ACTIVE

From Chuck Silcox, volunteer Board Member and Water Program Organizer

The Toilet Water-Saving Testing Program is still active and approved to repair toilets that waste water.

With the water and sewer bills costing \$23 per every 1,000 gals of water, this is an excellent place to reduce our expenses where we can. Any place we can conserve water we can reduce our expenses. When a toilet or faucet is changed, there are options with some devices that use less water; please choose wisely.



To test toilets, pick up dye tablets available at the Office. The description of how to use the dye tablets are attached to the bag. If your toilet shows to be leaking water, go to the Office and fill out a consent form with your contact info so a volunteer can come by to make the toilet repair.

If for some reason you can't test your toilet, we have volunteers who can come by and perform the test for you. Just call the office and ask to put your name on the list to test your toilet.

We are trying to get this started since the volunteers for the repairs are trying to get ahead of the return of the snowbirds.





2025-2026 REGISTRATION FORMS

Tew registration forms for the 2025-2026 annual golf membership and golf cart stickers are available for purchase at the Office.

July 1 was the date all new golf cart stickers/membership cards/10-pack vouchers were required.

The color of the stickers for Golf Carts changed as of July 1.

Golf Carts must display current stickers. Two will be issued; one to be placed on each side of the cart, not on cart windows – per written instructions that come with the stickers.

Golf carts are only permitted on the Golf Course and cart path while playing golf.

Please remember to sign-in and pay inside the Pro Shop when open, otherwise, please continue to sign in on the Pro Shop patio indicating time/address/ and annual membership number or 10-pack number. Cash payments via envelopes provided can be placed through slot. See fees below.

Fees as of July 1, for 2025-2026.

\$550 plus tax for annual membership fee

\$60 plus tax for the annual stickers for motorized golf carts

\$17 including tax for 9 holes

\$22 including tax for 18 holes

\$153 including tax for the 10-pack pre-paid greens fees, includes one free round of golf. To use voucher for 18 holes, add \$5 to the voucher you use when paying at the Pro Shop.

Palm Hill is a private golf course; payment is required to play.







How does fiber do this? When some fiber foods are digested, they basically become a sticky substance. In the bowel, this sticky substance "picks up" some of the cholesterol and sugars that is in your bowel from foods you have eaten. This substance, with some cholesterol and sugars stuck to it, is excreted out of the body, in the bathroom. Hence, helping to lower blood sugars and blood cholesterol.

Also, because fiber foods are filling and can give you a full feeling, this may play a role in you eating less and help with weight loss. As an added bonus, many high fiber foods are low in calories; think veggies!

It is important to make sure that you drink enough fluid with your high fiber diet, as fiber absorbs fluid to work. If you do not have enough fluid, then the fiber may not work or "move" and you could become constipated. Also, we know that fluid has so many other benefits for us!

Where do you find fiber? Fiber is found in vegetables, fruits, nuts, seeds, grain products, and legumes such as beans, peas and lentils. Eating a variety of these fiber foods is key, as these foods have a mixture of two types of fiber; soluble and insoluble.

How much fiber do you need? Aim for 21-30 grams per day. Most people only get half of this daily amount. Keep track of your fiber intake for a few days to see how much you get. If you need to increase your fiber intake, do it gradually over 7-10 days, to prevent gas and bloating. To determine your fiber intake, look at labels and/or look on line, especially for items like fruit and vegetables that do not typically have a label. For example, many people think they get enough fiber because they eat whole wheat bread or have a banana every day. A slice of whole wheat bread has only two grams of fiber and a banana has around three grams of fiber. It does take some work to get to 21-30 grams per day!

What about fiber supplements? They can help you to get closer to the 21-30 gram goal, but again, check the label. Many of these fiber supplements, whether, pill, powder, or wafer form, only have two to four grams of fiber. Again keep fluids up with these fiber supplements.

A few suggestions to increase daily fiber intake:

- Fill half your plate with vegetables at meal time
- Eat three pieces of fruit per day
- Eat whole wheat breads and pastas
- Have plain popcorn or unsalted nuts for a snack instead of potato chips
- Add lentils to soup, spaghetti sauces, salad
- Top yogurt with bran, flax, fruit nuts or seed

These fiber recommendations are for those without bowel issues. If you have bowel issues please consult your physician or dietitian about your fiber needs.

TEPTEMBER 2025 Rules and Regulations

Exterior work permits – VI - HOMESITE CARE & MAINTENANCE

A - <u>All additions</u>, <u>renovations</u>, <u>or modifications</u> to the home ("home" means the physical structure to include the carport and driveway) or the unit's grounds ("grounds" means the area outside the physical structure or footprint of the home) must be approved by management in writing before work is commenced.




• G – Homes and homesites <u>must be maintained in a clean</u>, orderly, and well-kept condition.

Traffic rules – X – PARKING RULES

- The <u>speed limit</u> in the park is 15 MPH. The speed limit applies to all motorized vehicles including eBikes. <u>Stop signs</u> must be observed. Golf carts and licensed mopeds shall not be operated by <u>anyone under sixteen (16) years of age</u>.
- <u>All homeowner and tenant vehicles must be registered</u>, if you get a new license (changing from another state to Florida or new license plate). This information must be provided to Management by completely filling out the Auto Decal Form.
 - All residents must have a <u>Palm Hill decal</u> displayed on the lower left corner of the windshield. Note: Replacing windshields or replacing a vehicle you are required to obtain a new decal even if license is the same.
- <u>Guests</u> of residents must display a <u>Temporary Parking permit</u> on the dashboard of their vehicle when on Palm Hill property. This can be obtained any time before guests arrive.
- All resident or guest owned vehicles parking on Palm Hill property shall have a current DMV registration. This applies to all states that require a <u>current DMV registration</u> (Florida does require current registration).

SANITATION FIELD

PALM HILL RULES AND REGULATIONS, SECTION 6 – Q:

Use of Sanitation Area: The sanitation area is available for the purpose of material handling of recyclables, non-recyclables, vegetation, and construction materials.

The use of the construction bin shall be used strictly for the purposes of construction material and household items such as furniture. Renovation debris, such as kitchen cupboards, shall be broken down as to minimize the volume required of the construction bin. Electronics, tires, paints, oil, metals including aluminum, and hazardous materials are not permitted. Items that can be recycled should be separated and placed by the appropriate refuse or recycle bin. Recycled items are not to be taken/removed by a resident or individual. No dumping of construction material or refuse directly on the ground is permitted under any circumstance(s).

Should the construction bin be filled, the office shall be notified, and appropriate arrangements made for disposal.

Should such abuse of the sanitation area occur, the cost of such cleanup will be borne by the resident and may include suspension of access and associated fining. Sanitation facilities are restricted to Palm Hill homes only. All others, including commercial use by contractors, individuals outside the corporation, will be considered unauthorized and trespassing.
