

COMMIT CAUTION" TO SAFELY SHARE PALM HILL STREETS DURING INFRASTRUCTURE WORK

wo major infrastructure projects are under way and ongoing in Palm Hill, and this means more work vehicles and more workers in our streets and yards.

Courtesy, caution and taking your time as you move through Palm Hill are more important than ever.

Infrastructure projects under way:

- IN THE SOUTH: The SPECTRUM conversion to fiberoptics project brings vehicles and workers to the South, moving across streets, between yards and streets to dig up the ground behind homes and lay the fiberoptic cables throughout the South. (North work was completed.)
- IN THE NORTH: The INLINER SOLUTIONS LLC of Clearwater Cured in Place Project (CIPP) is the underground pipe relining project that began in late September and will be ongoing in the North part of the Park through December. Phases 1 and 2 of that



project are expected to last through December. (The phases of the work after that will be announced.) Email blasts are advising residents when workers will be on their streets.

In November, lawn cutting is reduced to once a month, but that lawn cutting and the garbage and recycling collections by our maintenance team are also happening throughout the duration of the two major projects. In addition, the large package delivery trucks are with us, and are likely to be here more often as the holiday gift-gifting season approaches.

The Fall season welcomes back our snowbirds who will be adjusting to our 15 miles-per-hour (mph) speed limit and STOP signs on many corners.

Driving around could present surprises. You could turn a corner, ignore a Stop Sign and find yourself smack in the middle of some of this ongoing work. Some roads occasionally may be reduced to one lane during the work.

The workers are not an inconvenience. Palm Hill invited them here to do important and necessary infrastructure work.

Cooler temperatures as the weeks go by – especially in the afternoon - means more people are out and about bicycling, walking, greeting and chatting with returning neighbors.

Our roads could be crowded in the coming months.

Honoring and Remembering

Teterans Day is intended to thank and honor all those who served honorably in the military

— living and dead — whether in wartime or peace. Veterans Day is largely intended to
thank living Veterans for their service, to acknowledge that their contributions to our
national security are appreciated, and to underscore the fact that all those who serve have
sacrificed and done their duty.

There are about 18 million Veterans living among us, in every state and territory and from every walk of life.

Veterans Day was originally called Armistice Day.

In 1918, an armistice was reached between the Allies and Germany in Compiègne, France, declaring a cessation to hostilities on the Western Front effective on the 11th hour of the 11th of day of the 11th month.

America first marked the anniversary of this date one year later. World War I was a multinational effort. The name of the day and the types of commemorations differ, however.

Canada and Australia both call November 11 "Remembrance Day." Canada's observance is similar to the United States, except many of its citizens wear red poppy flowers to honor their war dead. In Australia, the day is more akin to the U.S. Memorial Day.

Great Britain calls it "Remembrance Day," too, but observes it on the Sunday closest to November 11 with parades, services and two minutes of silence in London to honor those who lost their lives in war.

TIK-TOK SITE LEADS TO PALM HILLERS' APPEARANCE ON THE KELLY CLARKSON SHOW

Palm Hill's Jane Croft, and daughter Gail Stott, Website Manager, were featured on The Kelly Clarkson Show October 1.

Jane and Gail are stars of a TikTok site and have garnered as many as three million "views" by Tik-Tokers in several countries.

It was more than a year ago that Gail began her site, "Caring for Mom" (#caringformom).

Gail posted photos and short clips of her mother and the pair have become a phenomenon that captured the attention of producers at NBC's Today Show. A story about them posted on that site attracted the attention of Kelly Clarkson's producers, also an NBC show.

On October 1, more than 80 Palm Hillers joined Gail and Jane at a "watch party" in the North Recreation Hall as Kelly Clarkson showed a zoom interview with Gail and mom Jane following the show's theme "It's Never Too Late". The segment was "What I'm Liking".

"Last March, I posted a video asking people to send my mother cards for her 102nd birthday in April. Mom received over 220 cards!" Gail said. "I read the followers' comments about her to my mom. It really makes her happy."

In one clip, Gail asked her mom what she wanted for dessert after dinner. "Cookies", Jane said. Boxes of cookies were mailed to Gail and her mother from Tik-Tokers. Some followers are from the United Kingdom, Australia and Portugal, Gail said.

"Some of the followers are also caring for their moms or others, and they relate to us," Gail said. "People love to watch her eat. I cook and post videos and many followers ask for the recipes I make for Mom."

Gail takes her mother to McDonald's for dinner before Bingo on Tuesdays. Photos of Jane sitting in the car, eating McDonald's meals are frequently on the Caring for Mom site and were shown on The Kelly Clarkson Show.

"We are making memories, one Happy Meal at a time," said Gail.

HAPPY THANKSGIVING!

In the United States, Americans will celebrate Thanksgiving November 27 this year. Many Canadians celebrate their Thanksgiving feast annually on the second Monday in October.

Mother of Thanksgiving

In 1827, the noted magazine editor and prolific writer Sarah Josepha Hale—author, among countless other things, of the nursery rhyme "Mary Had a Little Lamb"—launched a campaign to establish Thanksgiving as a national holiday. For 36 years, she published numerous editorials and sent scores of letters to governors, senators, presidents and other politicians, earning her the nickname the "Mother of Thanksgiving."

Abraham Lincoln finally heeded her request in 1863, at the height of the Civil War, in a proclamation entreating all Americans to ask God to "commend to his tender care all those who have become widows, orphans, mourners or sufferers in the lamentable civil strife" and to "heal the wounds of the nation."

REMEMBER HURRICANE SEASON EXTENDS THROUGH NOVEMBER 30

Iorida still has October and November left in the hurricane season. Preparation and Implanning are vital. Palm Hill homeowners are asked to put their shutters down and clear the home sites of any loose items that may become projectiles and damage other properties in the event of tropical storms or a hurricane.

Please remember if you are a year-round resident to make sure that you have your plan in place NOW. Do not wait until a storm approaches. SPECTRUM FIBER-OPTIC PROJECT UPDATE

pectrum has been working in Palm Hill laying the conduits that will contain the new fiber optics, said Bob Newport, board member. Once that phase is complete, Spectrum will then begin to connect the new system to the homes.



In the new system, residents will receive two XUMO streaming boxes as part of the bulk package. If a resident needs help with the new system, he or she should contact Spectrum. Specify to the customer service representative that your service is part of a bulk contract at Palm Hill in Largo, Florida.

Stay tuned for information on the ongoing changes via web blast.

TIPS/UPDATES FROM CHUCK SILCOX, Board Member

We are working with Spectrum to create a new 732 system that will be available with the new system.

The good thing about the new system is that you can sign into your account anywhere in the world and get all the channels; 732 should be available.

Points to note:

- 1. If you want to watch 732 now before the new system is up and running, and you update to the new XUMO boxes, keep an old set top box to access the old 732 channel.
- 2. We are working to get the new cloud version of 732 running and when up, both should be available for a while.
- 3. If you go to Spectrum and get the new XUMO box(es) and take them home but cannot make them work, call Spectrum and tell them the installation FAILED and you need help.

BUDGET PLANNING ANNUAL PROCESS EXPLAINED

Preparing our budget for the next fiscal year is an open process. Shareholders may participate in every Finance Committee meeting, and are encouraged to communicate with the Committee at any time, and attend the budget Town Hall.

November 2025

In its November meeting, the Finance Committee reviews actual to-date finances, and anticipated spending, to forecast funding needs for the remainder of the current year. It also looks at known rate increases and prospective inflation rates, and considers surpluses.

December 2025


At its mid-December meeting, the Committee amends its forecast for the remainder of the current year, and prepares a draft of the coming year's Operating Budget and the Capital Reserve Account. Plans are made for garnering shareholder input via a dedicated email.

January-February 2026

- In very **early January**, the Committee holds a Town Hall where residents may ask questions and suggest changes. (Date to be announced.)
- Shortly after the Town Hall, the Committee revises its forecasts for the remainder of the fiscal year and finalizes its recommended Budget to the Board.

 - In **mid-January**, the current Board votes to approve distributing the budget to shareholders. The election of Board members follows this.
 - By February 11, the proposed budget is mailed/emailed to all shareholders. March 2026
 - By March 13 the new Board must adopt the final budget, a minimum of two weeks prior to the fiscal year-end, to comply with statutory deadlines.
 - After the budget is adopted, payment information will be mailed to all shareholders by the Association's office.
 - March 31 End of 2025-2026 fiscal year.





If for some reason you can't test your toilet, we have volunteers who can come by and perform the test for you. Just call the office and ask to put your name on the list to test your toilet.

We are trying to get this started since the volunteers for the repairs are trying to get ahead of the return of the snowbirds.







SANITATION FIELD

PALM HILL RULES AND REGULATIONS, SECTION 6 – Q:

Use of Sanitation Area: The sanitation area is available for the purpose of material handling of recyclables, non-recyclables, vegetation, and construction materials.

The use of the construction bin shall be used strictly for the purposes of construction material and household items such as furniture. Renovation debris, such as kitchen cupboards, shall be broken down as to minimize the volume required of the construction bin. Electronics, tires, paints, oil, metals including aluminum, and hazardous materials are not permitted. Items that can be recycled should be separated and placed by the appropriate refuse or recycle bin. Recycled items are not to be taken/removed by a resident or individual. No dumping of construction material or refuse directly on the ground is permitted under any circumstance(s).

Should the construction bin be filled, the office shall be notified, and appropriate arrangements made for disposal.

Should such abuse of the sanitation area occur, the cost of such cleanup will be borne by the resident and may include suspension of access and associated fining. Sanitation facilities are restricted to Palm Hill homes only. All others, including commercial use by contractors, individuals outside the corporation, will be considered unauthorized and trespassing.


