Please note that all Clubhouse bookings (requests to use the Clubhouse for private events) are being handled by the Park Management Office (727-531-9105).

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






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

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Romance Scams

Romance scams occur when a criminal adopts a fake online identity to gain a victim's affection and trust. The scammer then uses the illusion of a romantic or close relationship to manipulate and/or steal from the victim.

The scammer's intention is to establish a relationship as quickly as possible, endear himself to the victim, and gain trust. Scammers may propose marriage and make plans to meet in person, but that will never happen. Eventually, they will ask for money.

If someone you meet online needs your bank account information to deposit money, they are most likely using your account to carry out other theft and fraud schemes.

Tips for Avoiding Romance Scams:

- Be careful what you post and make public online. Scammers can
 use details shared on social media and dating sites to better
 understand and target you.
- Research the person's photo and profile using online searches to see if the image, name, or details have been used elsewhere.
- Go slowly and ask lots of questions.
- Beware if the individual seems too perfect or quickly asks you to leave a dating service or social media site to communicate directly.
- Beware if the individual attempts to isolate you from friends and family or requests inappropriate photos or financial information that could later be used to extort you.
- Beware if the individual promises to meet in person but then always comes up with an excuse why he or she can't. If you haven't met the person after a few months, for whatever reason, you have good reason to be suspicious.
- Never send money to anyone you have only communicated with online or by phone.


Family Scams

Scammers are good at **pretending to be someone that they're not**. They try to trick you into thinking **a loved one is in trouble.**

Once the scammer makes you think they're your grandson and in trouble, they pressure you to quickly send them money. **But it's all a scam.**Your family member was never in trouble.

- The scammer will say it's **urgent** and that you're the only one who can help.
- The scammer might tell you it's important to keep it secret. They don't want you talking to other family members and friends and realizing it's a scam.
- The scammers will **play with your emotions.** They're counting on you to act quickly to help your family or friend. And they're counting on you to pay without stopping to check out whether there's really an emergency. If you get a call like this, you can be sure this is a scam.




hundreds of unused Teddy Bears. This can't happen without all the residents' donations.

Have each interested party send a text from their cell phone to (727) 304-4552 with the following message (as indicated) in the body of the text: Join EBO Res

Resident will then get a reply asking them to respond with their name and lot number, and once done, the registration is complete.

Ducks/Wildlife

Please do not feed or put out feeders accessible to ducks or other wildlife. It is illegal in the State of Florida to feed wildlife and you could be charged a \$100 fine for the first infraction.



Parking Rules

his is a reminder RE: the parking rules as well as a few changes to occur effective Jan 1st.

Each home is allowed TWO cars per home, any extras must be removed from the property right away.

You will be towed for the following:

- 1. Parking in any space around the clubhouse, office or mailboxes between the hours of 8 am and 10 pm, unless you are using the amenities. (900-530 for the office)
- 2. Parking in any space around the clubhouse, office or mailboxes between the hours of 10 pm and 8 am without a RED hang tag or a YELLOW dated guest pass. (530-900 for the office) You can register for either at the office.
- 3. Parking on the street anytime between 1 am and 6 am.
- 4. Parking anywhere on the property without a general parking sticker.
- 5. Parking a commercial vehicle, anywhere on property. This would be any vehicle with any advertising on it. Or any vehicle that is used for commercial rather than personal use.

Board Meeting

here are many benefits to joining the Home Owner's Association aside from voting rights. HOA Board Meetings are official meetings of the Board of Directors and meeting are open to all HOA members and all residents are encouraged to attend but only HOA members can speak and only to agenda items. There is a sign in sheet at every meeting so that the Secretary can determine who is in attendance, to determine HOA members present, and if quorums are met. HOA members can also have an agenda item presented for consideration by contacting the Secretary or attending an agenda meeting. Most recently, HOA members were given a coupon for a discount on January's breakfast and HOA members were given a reduced price on the ice cream social held in February. It pays to join!

PET Rules and Regulations

All pets must be approved by MANAGEMENT in writing before the pet's owner moves into the COMMUNITY, or before RESIDENT obtains a pet after move-in.



No more than two (2) pets per household.

All pets must be on a leash no longer than six (6) feet at any time the pet is outside of RESIDENT'S homesite.

Pets may not be tied unattended outside of RESIDENT'S manufactured home at any time. Pets may not be walked on the lawns of any homesite in the COMMUNITY, other than RESIDENT'S homesite.

No pet enclosures, including, but not limited to dog houses, are allowed. Pets must be kept inside RESIDENT'S manufactured home if unattended.


Excessive noise is not allowed, and pets must not annoy RESIDENT'S neighbors. Pets must not be left alone if they bark, cry or whine when by themselves.

No pets are allowed in the COMMUNITY recreation areas at any time.

Guests' pets are not permitted in the COMMUNITY.

Reminder on Trash Policies

he dump will be open 8-3 on Tues and Friday, and 8-11 on Saturday. We are going to try this to see if we can keep the illegal dumping under control but still giving you all access. A reminder/the rule, if it wont fit in



a large size trash can, it does not belong in the dump area. No furniture, chemicals of any kind, propane tanks, paint, electronics, construction debris, grills, etc...ever. The compactor is for your regular bagged up household trash, the big dumpster is for yard waste and the blue container is for recyclables. ANYTHING ELSE IS THE RESIDENTS RESPONSIBILITY TO HAVE HAULED OFF THE PROPERTY because Valet Living won't pick it up either. If you are caught dumping anything else, that is actually a crime, you will be fined by the county, get a violation letter from us, and we will close the area back up. (we don't want that)

Beginning 8/22, the maintenance staff will no longer be going around to pick up trash or yard waste. Valet Living will still pick up your trash, but all of the same policies above apply pertaining to what is allowed in the dump area and what they will and won't pick up. Everything bagged in trash bags and boxes broken down should be it. It doesn't make sense to have them go back and do the same thing we already pay a vendor for and use up man hours when there are so many other things that need attention on the property. This does include yard waste, you will have to take that to the dumpster because Valet Living does not pick that up. I have faith that this will be a smooth transition, if you have any questions, please call us at (727) 531-9105. Thank you.

Boxes MUST be broken down and put into the Recycling container. • No bags whatsoever should be placed in the roll off container. This container is for unbagged yard waste, and other household trash. If you have bagged yard waste, you can put it into the compactor or open the bag and dump the contents into the roll off. • The roll off container is not for bulky furniture or construction material...if it doesn't fit into an outside type of garbage can, it does not belong in the dump area. Just as the park is not responsible for you getting to work on time, paying your cell phone bill, or getting your oil changed, we must follow Pinellas County Solid Waste Ordinances and are not responsible for taking your old mattresses, tires, appliances, TVs, large bulky furniture, paint, batteries, solvents, construction debris, etc. Again, the roll off and compactor is for "household" trash only. Therefore, you will need to arrange to have prohibited items hauled away or you can take it to the landfill which we believe costs approximately \$11 for a load. The Pinellas County Solid Waste landfill is located at 3095 114th Ave. N., St. Petersburg, FL 33716, about 10 miles away. Their phone number is 727-464-7500. There are several junk removal companies, and we know of one junk hauler, Tampa Bay Junk Pros, who may be offering \$50 off for junk/furniture/ appliance removal. Their number is 727-404-5100. • Do not fill the roll off container past the fill line, otherwise it will not be emptied resulting in having to lockdown the dumpster area which is inconvenient for all. If it is full, you may place your items to the side of the container so maintenance can put it in for you once the container is emptied.

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

We're committed to maintaining a safe, respectful, and well-managed community—but we can't fix what we don't know about. If you witness a violation or have a concern, **you must come speak to us directly**. We cannot act on second-hand information.

Here's why this matters:

- Complaints must be **submitted in writing** so we have a clear paper trail.
- We are legally required to follow a formal process, which includes sending a **series of official letters** to the individual involved.
- In serious cases, this process can lead to **court involvement and even eviction**—but only if we have proper documentation.
- We cannot force compliance or remove someone without going through the legal system.

How to file a complaint:

- Follow up in writing—email is preferred, but we also have a form you can fill out.
