Identity Theft Warning signs of identity theft

- Bills for items you did not buy
- · Debt collection calls for accounts you did not open
- Information on your credit report for accounts you did not open
- · Denials of loan applications
- Mail stops coming to, or is missing from, your mailbox

How to report identity theft

To report identity theft, contact:

- The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) online at IdentityTheft.gov or call 1-877-438-4338
- The three major credit reporting agencies. Ask them to place fraud alerts and a credit freeze on your accounts.
- The **fraud department at your credit card issuers**, bank, and other places where you have accounts

How to protect yourself from identity theft

- Do not answer phone calls, texts, social media messages, or email from numbers or people you do not know.
- Do not share personal information like your bank account number, Social Security number, or date of birth.
- Collect your mail every day and place a hold on your mail when you will be on vacation or away from your home.
- Review credit card and bank account statements. Watch for and report unauthorized or suspicious transactions.
- Understand how ATM skimming works and how to protect yourself
- · Learn when it is safe to use a public Wi-Fi network
- Store personal information, including your Social Security card, in a safe place. Do not carry it in your wallet.

Imposter Scam

The top types of imposter scams:

An imposter scammer may call, text, or email to convince you they are **someone** in **authority**. They may even use caller ID to make it look like they are calling from an official government or business' number. To commit identity theft, they try to get you to send money or a gift card or share personal information.

- Government imposter scams Unless you contact them first, government agencies typically initiate communication with you by letter. Unexpected contact or demands through any other method may be a scam.
- IRS imposter scams scammers pretend you owe the IRS money for taxes and may threaten legal action
- Social Security imposter scams scammers claim there is a problem with your Social Security account or promise to increase your benefits
- Charity scams scammers pretend to be from a real or fake charity and try to get you to contribute
- **Grandparent scams** scammers pretend to be a grandchild or other relative who needs emergency financial help
- Tech support scams scammers tell you your computer's security is at risk and try to remotely access your device and steal personal information or ask for payment
- Scammers may also pretend to be from your bank or a company you do business with. You might be told you owe money or there is a problem with your account.





A CHRISTMAS CAROL: Fast Facts

alled "the second greatest Christmas story ever told," Charles Dickens' A Christmas Carol has endured generations of faithful audiences since its publication in 1843. History and literary lore tell of the author's speedy writing and self-financed publication of the novel — he wrote the story in six weeks, printed 6,000 copies that sold out in five days, and only turned a meager profit because he had foot the bill for printing.



Nevertheless, Dickens' story about a sinner who's given one last chance at redemption has proven to be a timeless work of art that's fostered much scholarly research. Take a look at a few facts that reflect the historical and personal context of A Christmas Carol.

The cranky, miserly Ebenezer Scrooge is thought to have been inspired by two historical figures: Thomas Malthus and John Elwes. Malthus was an economist who wrote that population growth would diminish the opportunities of the population. He associated his views with Charles Darwin's theory of natural selection and advocated against assisting the poor in the hope that it would "decrease the surplus population." Dickens includes Malthus's philosophy in one of Scrooge's infamous passages: "And the Union workhouses? Are they still in operation? ... If they would rather die, they had better do it, and decrease the surplus population."

Elwes was a politician who was extremely frugal despite having incredible wealth. He inherited £100,000 (about \$13 million today) from his father's death in 1718, and then inherited £250,000 (about \$32 million) in 1763 from his uncle's death. He reportedly dressed very poorly, rarely sought medical care and let his mansions crumble for lack of upkeep. He would even go to bed very early to avoid buying candles for night time and eat molding food to avoid buying fresh food. He died in 1789 and left an estate of £500,000 (about \$67 million) to his sons.

Dickens' childhood was much like the Cratchit family. He was the second of eight children, and his parents had only a modest income. Though the Dickens' circumstances weren't as dire as the Cratchits', they were always financially poor. Dickens' father even served time in Marshalsea Prison, a debtors' prison, for owing £40 to a local baker. He was confined for three months before settling his debts.

It is thought that Dickens's nephew — who, like Tim, suffered from health problems and died prematurely at age 9 — inspired the spirit of the character. Researchers agree that Tiny Tim suffers from one of the common medical conditions that plagued the poor of the time. Conditions include tuberculosis, Pott's disease, rickets and renal tuberculosis acidosis. These conditions were treatable so long as the patient's family could afford it and were only fatal if left alone.

Dickens wrote heavily about the conflict between financial need and familial relationships in Victorian-era England, occasionally writing to instigate social change. He had originally wanted to write a pamphlet called, "An Appeal to the People of England on behalf of the Poor Man's Child," as a means of addressing the issues of the poor and of child labor. Instead, he decided to use the lens of a fictional story — A Christmas Carol — to comment on the crisis.

At the time of A Christmas Carol's publication, many people were somewhat confused by Scrooge gifting the Cratchits a turkey at the end. A goose was the traditional English holiday meal. Goose was the affordable meal option for middle- and lower-class families, as turkeys had typically only been served by high society. Many scholars believe Dickens' choice of having Scrooge opt for turkey shows how eager he is to treat the Cratchit family to grand holiday feast.

Charity plays a significant role in A Christmas Carol, as Scrooge comes to realize the importance of looking out for his fellow man by the story's end. Dickens was a lifelong philanthropist and dedicated much of his literary work (as well as journalistic appeals to society at large) to drawing attention to what he felt was a duty to give back to those who have little. As a result of his influence and the publication of A Christmas Carol in 1843, British newspapers reported a considerable spike in charitable donations in 1844. Members of the wealthy class (particularly the industrial revolution's "nouveau riche" class) dramatically increased their charitable giving efforts after being inspired by the holiday tale.

Fun Facts & Trivia

- The artificial Christmas tree originated in Germany and was originally made of metal wire and decorated with goose, turkey, ostrich or swan feather. The feathers were often dyed green to imitate pine needles
- Edsel Ford, further president of Ford Motor Company, wrote the following letter to Santa from Detroit, Michigan: "Dear Santa Claus, I Haven't had any Christmas tree in 4 years and I have broken my trimmings and I want a pair of roller skates and a book I can't think of anything more. I want you to think of something more. Good by." Edsel Ford
- The first eggnog made in the US was consumed in 1607 in a Jamestown settlement according to reports by Captain John Smith.
- In the 16th century, Martin Luther was said to have decorated a small Christmas tree with candles to show his children how stars twinkled through the dark knight.

Where did the tradition of hanging stockings originate?

The tradition of hanging stockings varies from country to country. Generally, it is believed that the night before Christmas, the stockings were hung over the fireplace to dry. At some point during the night, St. Nicholas,

in his trek down the chimney or his passing over the home, lost some gold coins or small presents down the chimney, and the gifts landed in the stockings, only to be found to the sheer



delight of the stockings' owners in the morning. To this day, children all over the world leave shoes or stockings by the fireplace or door, hoping to find specials treats when they wake up in the morning.

Where did mistletoe come from?

Mistletoe has long been held sacred by ancient civilizations: The Druids would cut mistletoe from an oak tree with a golden sickle; the branches had to be caught before they touched the ground to preserve their sanctity. The branches were then divided into sprigs and hung over doorways as protection against evil. It was also believed that a sprig of mistletoe placed in a baby's cradle would protect the child from goblins, or that giving a sprig to the first cow calving would protect the entire herd. Mistletoe is also seen as a symbol of peace and joy. During the time of the Druids, whenever enemies met under the mistletoe in the forest, they had to lay down their arms and observe a truce. The custom of hanging a ball of mistletoe from the ceiling and exchanging a kiss as a sign of friendship, goodwill, or even love, is said to have originated from that tradition.

How did Candy Canes come to be so popular?

During the 17th century, throughout Europe, religious ceremonies were held in honor of the Christmas holiday at the living creche, or the Nativity scene. It is said that at the urging of the choirmaster at the Cologne Cathedral in Germany, craftsmen created white sticks of candy shaped like shepherd's crooks to be given to children to keep them quiet during the ceremony. During the mid-1800s, a man in Ohio used these "hooks" of candy cane to decorate his tree and as a means to entertain his young nieces and nephews. Many who saw his decorations went home to experiment with canes of their own, and their popularity grew. Nearly a half century later, red stripes were added to the normally white canes of sugar, and the candy cane as we know it today was born!

Meaning of the Candy Cane

Many years ago, a candy maker wanted to make a candy that would symbolize the meaning of Christmas...Jesus.

The hard candy was shaped like a J to represent Jesus as a rock of all ages. The white was made to represent the pureness od Jesus. The red represents the blood that jesus shed to save us from our sins.


